

# Soviet Troops Set to Quit East Europe

LONDON, Oct. 30— The Soviet Union today announced it is ready to discuss withdrawal of Soviet troops from East Europe.

Radio Moscow broadcast a formal announcement on relations with East European nations which said the Soviet Union would discuss the question of its forces stationed in the Warsaw Pact countries of Poland, Hungary and Romania.

Bulgaria and Albania were not mentioned in the broadcast.

The Warsaw Pact, established in May, 1955, linked the Soviet Union and the East Europe nations in an organization similar to NATO. Soviet troops are now in Hungary under the terms of that pact.

The government declaration admitted "downright mistakes" had been made in the formation of the East European states since World War II.

It said there were "violations and mistakes which infringed the principles of equality in relations between socialist states."

The Soviet government issued a formal declaration on relations with the East European nations, stating it stood ready to discuss those relations "so as to remove any possibility of violating the principle of national sovereignty."
