

151. INITIAL REPORT ON REVOLUTIONARY  
CONFERENCE HELD IN BUFFALO

(Buffalo, October 7, 1972) - The Revolutionary Conference, "Problems of Proletarian Revolution in the United States" was held in Buffalo, N.Y., October 1-7. Over 175 revolutionary Americans attended from all across the country and participated in revolutionary summation of their practical work. Several practical measures were adopted to further the task of building the Party of the Proletariat on the basis of Mao Tsetung Thought and organizing proletarian revolution.

A great Mass Democracy, lasting six hours and involving over 500 people, was held on the topic, "Which Way America - Communism or Fascism?" at the State University of New York at Buffalo. The disruptions and diversions of the revisionists and other social-fascists of the Holy Alliance of the so-called "Left" were defeated and their political line was exposed among the people.

On October 7 a Grand Rally was held to close the conference. The refusal of the U.S. fascist customs authorities to permit Comrades Robert A. Cruise, National Secretary of the Communist Party of

Canada (Marxist-Leninist), and Paul Levesque of the Communist Party of Quebec (Marxist-Leninist), to cross the border to attend was thunderously denounced by the assembled participants.

Over 175 members and supporters of the American Communist Workers Movement (Marxist-Leninist), fraternal organizations and members of the broad masses raised their fists and resoundingly declared that they would dedicate their lives to building the Communist Party of the U.S.A. (Marxist-Leninist) and fighting for the proletarian revolution. end item.
