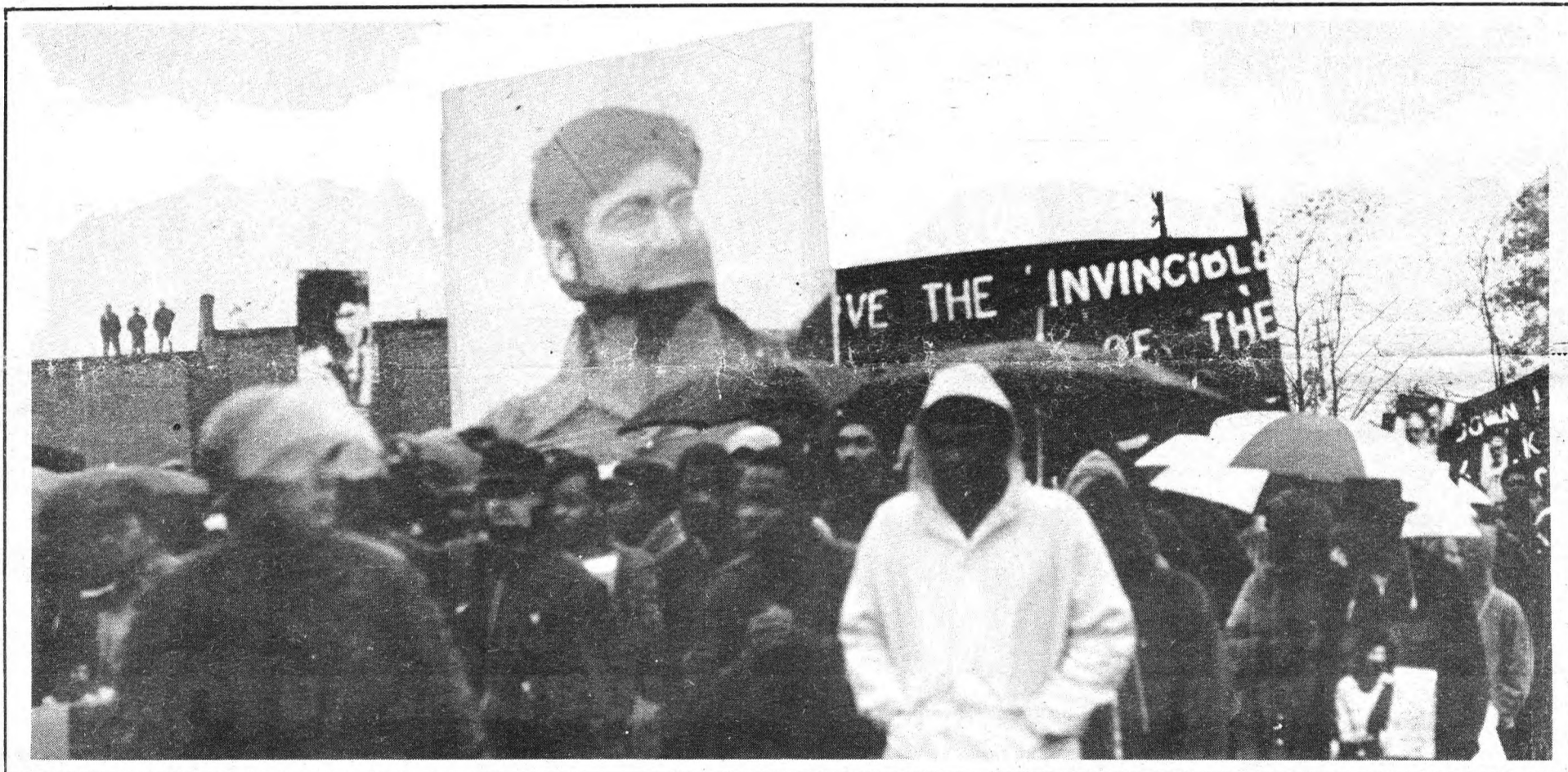
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## 1,000 March to Bury Our Fallen Comrades

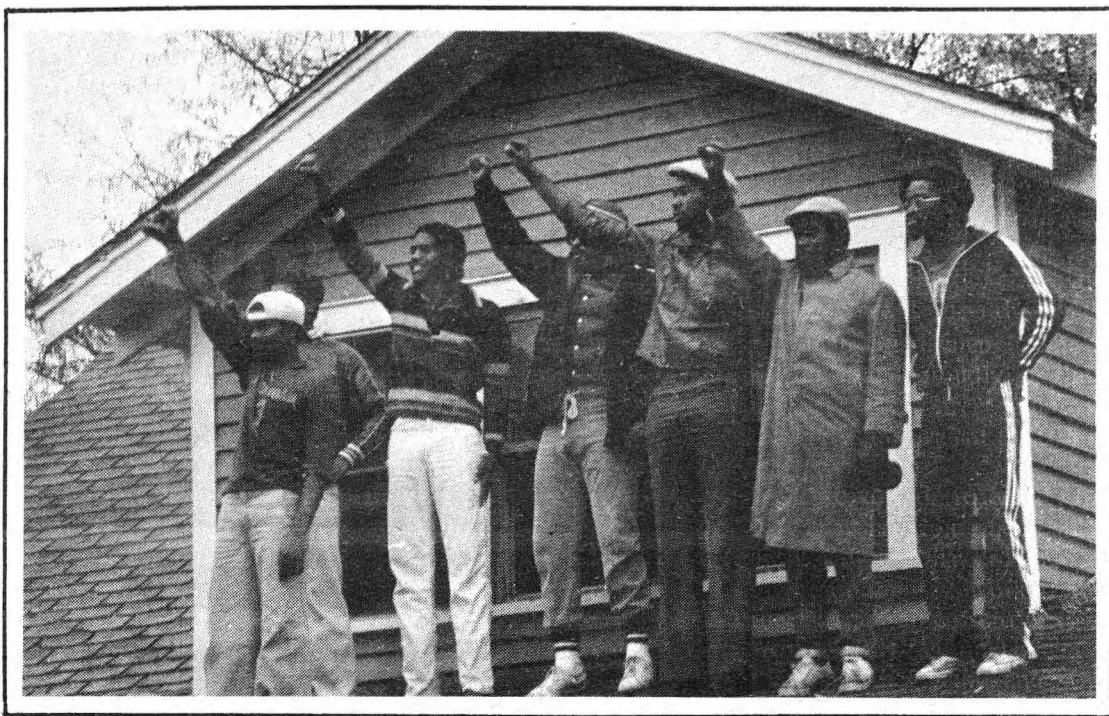
*We are soldiers in the army

GREENSBORO, N.C.—Greensboro was an armed camp. The showdown was on—a thousand marchers taking on 1,000 pigs and National Guardsmen. “We are soldiers,” sang the marchers, solemnly and proudly, as the burial procession started and filed up East Market Street against the wind and rain on the way to the cemetery. “We’ve got to fight though some fall at our side.”

### “We’ve Got to Hold Up the Bloodstained Banner”

They had come from all over the Black Belt South and as far away as California, Colorado and Ohio to rally around the banner of the Communist Workers Party (CWP). They came in answer to the Party’s call to battle, to fight to bury the five Communist Workers Party comrades who had been brutally assassinated by the Nazi/KKK scum and government agents the week before.

CHICAGO, Ill.—The Communist Workers Party has put two-faced Ted Kennedy and the rest of the lying politicians on notice that the heat's on them. Knowing that dog-tailed Edward Kennedy would be in Chicago's Polish community on November 8, the Party went to expose this swindler with a "liberal" mask. While Teddy was grinning and shaking hands, one comrade slipped through the secret service security and busted him dead on the chest with an egg.

The egg, signed, sealed and delivered by the Party lets all the crooked politicians know that 1980 will be the roughest election year for them ever. There won't be anywhere they can run and hide without having to answer for the murder of the CWP 5.

The comrade was arrested for "disorderly conduct" and fined \$35 (some parking tickets cost more). The capitalist politicians know that elections put them in the public limelight. On the one hand they have to be out among the masses to put on a show of having popular support, but on the other hand they don't dare promote the Communist Workers Party, the real leadership of the U.S. workers.

While the press tried to bury the Communist Workers Party's action and distort it as the act of an "anti-abortionist," Kennedy got the message. On the plane leaving the city, Kennedy spoke to reporters saying that he was going to "experiment" by making "more appearances before small groups and more face-to-face exchanges with individuals" and less appearances before "traditional mass rallies." This, he said, would "at the same time, provide him with an added measure of personal security."

### Mike Nathan's Co-workers Walk Out, Carrying On His Communist Spirit

DURHAM, N.C.—With vengeance in their hearts, the workers from the Lincoln Community Health Center walked right off the job the Monday after their co-worker, Mike Nathan, was murdered by the FBI and KKK/Nazi's. The majority of the workers are Afro-Americans. They were angered even more by the lies spread by the hospital administration that communists are "outsiders, trouble-makers."

The ex-slave-owning and plantation owning Watts family built Lincoln smack in the middle of Durham's Afro-American community in the early 1900's, so that their former slaves would not go to the hospital the Watts built for the plantation owners. For years it was the only place that blacks could get hospital care. In the early 1970's, Lincoln hospital was cut back to a community clinic serving mostly Afro-Americans, poor and working class people.

Durham's Afro-American community rose up when the city tried to close

Lincoln down for financial reasons. Clear on his stand to fight class and national oppression in the Black Belt South, Comrade Mike quit his high-paying job at Duke Medical Center to help lead the tooth and nail fight against cutbacks. His communist work was deepened through his organizing study-training circles which strengthened and broadened the fight beyond Lincoln.

Throughout the struggle, as Lincoln Hospital became Lincoln Community Health Center, workers knew Mike for his quiet, gentle manner, absolute honesty and courage, in addition to the uncompromising, staunch character of the Party's line he represented so well.

After the murder of the Communist Workers Party Five, the hospital administration has cynically tried to split Comrade Mike away from the communist principles that guided his life and his death. But communism is concrete, not an abstract idea. The good that Comrade Mike did while he lived, the close

ties he had with workers and how he died—all flowed from the Party's guidance and his dedication to the Party and to Marxism-Leninism-Mao Tsetung Thought.

At Mike's memorial the following Wednesday, his widow, Marty, conducted the service and exposed the administration's lies. With example after example she showed how Mike's desire to serve the people was why he became a doctor. That same desire along with his experience in trying to change the system led him to become a communist.

The majority attending the memorial were black workers who had known Mike deeply. They knew it was the Party's line, the need for socialist revolution to begin to abolish all national and class oppression that Mike lived and died for. Dedicating his life to the Party of the working class and communism, Mike had taken the lead in support work for Southern Africa, organizing tens of thousands of dollars in

medical aid to the liberation struggle in Zimbabwe. Comrade Mike gave his life to save another comrade's life. This selflessness is a concentrated expression of the Communist Workers Party line. This is why the Central Committee of the Communist Workers Party made Comrade Mike Nathan a Party member on his deathbed.

The ties between the Party, the working class and the masses of all oppressed nationalities are unbreakable and no amount of bourgeois slander and lies can shake it. The workers' walkout, fully aware that Mike was a communist, is living testimony to the ties Mike had with them and their love and respect for the way he lived and died. At Lincoln Community Health Center, under the Party's leadership, class fighters are being trained. With Comrade Mike Nathan's invincible spirit shining like a beacon, the Party will produce countless Mikes to serve the struggle for proletarian revolution. □

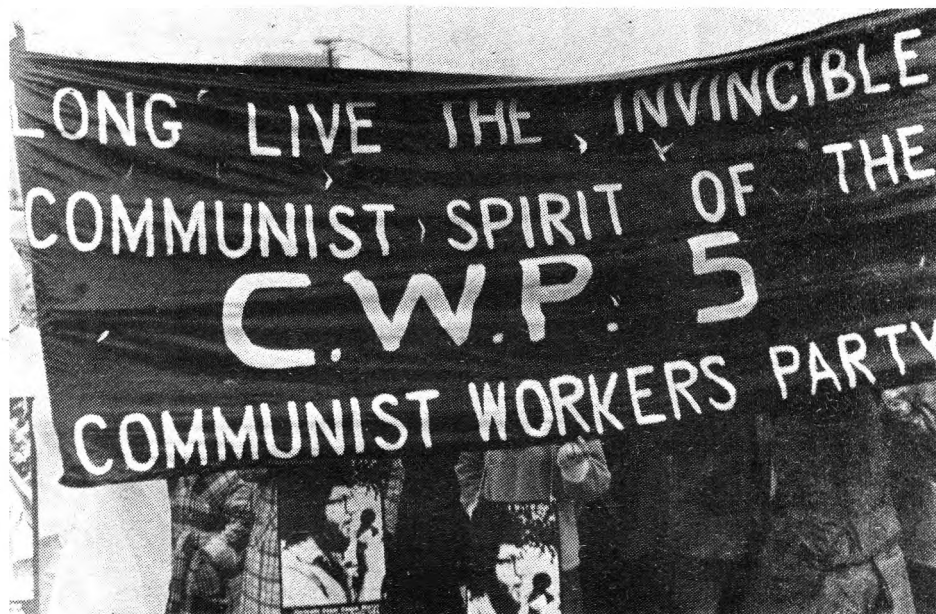
# BOSTON: Party/Masses Punch Out FBI

## Communist Workers Party Grills FBI Boss

BOSTON, Ma.—Inspired by the news of the Communist Workers Party armed burial march in Greensboro, North Carolina the Sunday before, Afro-American students organized a vigil on the Harvard University campus. Speakers from the Communist Workers Party were invited and told the 200 students about the need to avenge the deaths of the five comrades and make it the costliest ever to the bourgeoisie. At the end of the speech, students were told that the head of the FBI, William Webster, was speaking at Harvard's J.F. Kennedy Library and that the Party was taking him on. Jumping at the chance, they pulled themselves into formation and marched over a mile. No one knew if they would be able to get in but they were determined to get a fighting chance.

### Barefisted And Enraged The CWP and Masses Whip FBI

Two hundred yards from the building, the demonstrators charged the front door with Communist Workers Party members in the lead, just as Comrade Cesar charged automatic fire to save others. The 50 FBI agents and six campus cops were caught flat-footed. The demonstrators beat their asses black and blue and kicked them for good measure. The sight of a Party-led steamroller scared these dogs out of their wits. They didn't dare fight back, and barely scrambled inside the building, bolting the doors closed behind them. But bolted doors couldn't stop the masses. The demonstrators got their bullhorns out and chanted and agitated outside the door for a solid hour. Their chants



were so loud and powerful that Webster couldn't go on with his speech. He stopped and let the demonstrators in if they "kept quiet." This victory was in sharp contrast to what had happened to the "R-r-revolutionary Communist" Party when they tried to get in the building hours before us. The FBI carried them and threw them out on their behinds.

Webster went on, running off at the mouth about the FBI tactics of infiltration, and we interrogated him on the spot. We demanded to speak on the Communist Workers Party Five and speak now. Webster gave up the podium and sat down. A Communist Workers Party speaker denounced the FBI and the rest of the government agents who organized the assassination of our beloved comrades right to their faces. When we were through we left, chanting.

The *Boston Globe* tried to squash the whole thing, burying it in a little blurb in the paper. Suppression of the truth won't stop us. The FBI and their capitalist masters know that we will charge wave upon wave with the same dauntless spirit of the five comrades. The FBI and the bourgeoisie is on notice—the Communist Workers Party has just begun to exact vengeance for the five comrades. □

## FBI Whacked by CWP/RYL- Pig Drops Gun

SAN FRANCISCO, Ca.—Armed with sticks, a tight formation of Revolutionary Youth League members chanted defiantly into the faces of a line of San Francisco riot police in front of the FBI office building on November 15. Meanwhile, eight Communist Workers Party members and friends marched into the building to confront these dogs about their dirty work in Greensboro. Inside, one angry Korean youth whacked a cop over the head with a stick. This bumbling pig, shivering nervously and hands sweating, dropped his gun on the floor (kerplunk!) while trying to pull it out. Others came to the aid of the youth in a scramble for the gun. After a brief tug of war, the cops were forced by the militant chanting and tight organization of the 60 class fighters outside to let all eight comrades go free.

Two days before in Los Angeles, Communist Workers Party members and friends hit the FBI office in yet another act of vengeance for the murder of the

Communist Workers Party Five. In city after city, town after town, the Communist Workers Party is keeping these capitalist dogs on the run and making the bourgeoisie pay dearly for their cowardly crimes. They won't have a minute of peace as we charge wave upon wave to avenge our comrades' murders.

On November 26 Comrade Nelson Johnson and other Communist Workers Party members, along with the 14 Klansmen and Nazis who were arrested on November 3rd after the assassinations will be arraigned and tried in Greensboro, N.C. The following week on December 6 there will be a hearing for the Communist Workers Party members and friends who were arrested for upholding their right of armed self-defense on the day of the funeral march. The Communist Workers Party will have a fiery demonstration to demand that the state "Drop all charges against the anti-Nazi/KKK demonstrators!" □

# MAKE THE SHAH FACE IRANIAN PEOPLE'S JUSTICE!

Angered by the U.S.'s harboring the criminal Shah, the Iranian people are demanding his immediate extradition to Iran for trial. Hundreds of thousands of Iranian people demonstrated against the U.S. government. Students took over the U.S. embassy and are holding the staff hostage until the U.S. hands over the Shah. Firmly behind the Iranian people's demand, Ayatollah Khomeini defied all U.S. economic and military threats. This is a great blow against U.S. imperialism. The courageous actions of the Iranians has inspired all oppressed peoples and countries of the world.

## Iron Will Of the Iranian People Shatters U.S. Blackmail

In the last twelve days, the U.S. blackmail tactics have been shattered by the Iranian people with Khomeini. The imperialists' "No crude, no food" tactics backfired in their face. "We know how to fast" was Khomeini's answer to the U.S.'s threat to cut off food exports to Iran. Hundreds of thousands of Iranians immediately pledged to fast for five days in support of his statement. The U.S. military maneuvers in the Indian Ocean and Fort Hampton, and its threat to invade Iran to rescue the embassy staff scared no one. "We are a nation of 35 million and many of these people are looking forward to martyrdom. We will move with 35 million; after they have all been martyred, then they can do what they want with Iran. We are not afraid of these threats. We are fighters," Khomeini said. Iranian soldiers demonstrated proudly behind his call.

A country of 35 million people firmly united behind a single call, fearing neither hunger nor death, are defying the U.S. imperialists. This is the precious fighting spirit of the Iranian people. With this same invincible spirit, the Chinese people, under Mao's leadership, made both superpowers tremble and made the five martyrs of the Communist Workers' Party, USA charge with bare fists and picket signs against the Klan and Nazis—it's the spirit that puts the third world peoples and the Communist Workers Party beyond defeat. The Iranian people have proven to the world once again that U.S. imperialism is a paper tiger.

## Iranian People's Unity Strengthened Through Struggle

Not only are the students, the army, the workers and peasants rallying behind the cause and Khomeini's leadership, but so too are the majority of the petty bourgeoisie and national bourgeoisie. The unity of the people is being forged more tightly in this new wave of struggle against U.S. imperialism.

The tactic of taking over the U.S. embassy was the result of an internal struggle within Iran. Since the Iranian revolution, there has been a struggle with the Bazargan government representing the vacillating national bourgeoisie on the one hand, and the Revolutionary Council taking a more consistent anti-imperialist stand on the other. Right before the U.S. smuggled the

Shah in, the foreign minister of the Bazargan government secretly met with Brezinski in Algeria without consulting Khomeini. This action exposed the Bazargan government. The Revolutionary Council, however, has taken the more revolutionary tactic—the holding of the embassy. The Bazargan government was forced to step down and the Revolutionary Council became the dominant power. This is a step forward toward continuing the revolution in Iran. This change of leadership immediately strengthened the Iranian revolution and the fight against both superpowers.

The U.S.'s threats to cut off food exports to Iran and to stop importing Iranian oil have not broken the fighting

American people through this issue is a most important gain for them, and a backlash for the U.S. people, in the last decade.

A clear example was Carter's November 11th order to stop oil imports from Iran. The U.S. boycott of Iranian oil in no way hurts Iran financially since Iran can always sell oil to other countries who badly need it (probably at a fairer price). Carter's order was meant to rally the American people and Congress behind the so-called oil "conservation" program and the deregulation of the oil industry, something he's failed to achieve throughout the past year. This tough posture toward Iran is mainly aimed at

spirit of the Iranian people one bit. On the contrary, the Iranian masses are grasping the importance of having a self-sufficient economy. Building a self-sufficient economy has been the most difficult task confronting the Iranian revolution for the last eight months. Through years of exploitation, the U.S. imperialists have distorted Iran's and other third world countries' economies. Because of this, Iran's economy is dominated by one industry—oil—and is economically dependent on the U.S. for many necessities. The Iranian people are seeing that without economic independence there can be no real political independence. These threats by the U.S. imperialists will not make the Iranian masses bow down, but will spur on the development of their own economy even more.

## U.S. Bourgeoisie's "Tough" Appearance To Tighten Its Grip At Home

While the U.S. imperialists haven't been able to shake the will of the Iranian people and Khomeini, they have used the issue at home to stir up a chauvinist tide against Iranians. Carter has the appearance of giving strong leadership, but actually he's desperate. The ability of the capitalists to rally the

resolving the "crisis of confidence" at home for the bourgeoisie.

Another example is the order to deport Iranian students who may not have legitimate visas. It is a direct act of provocation against the Iranian government by attacking Iranian students in the U.S., and it serves to prepare the ground for future attacks on people from all third world countries and oppressed nationalities living in this country. Khomeini has already made it clear that Iranian students are welcome to return anytime to Iranian universities with full fellowships and similar academic status they have in the U.S. It is the U.S. government who is anxious to attract Iranian intellectuals to drain Iran so as to undermine the Iranian economy and to recruit some of them as U.S. agents when they return home. After the Iranian revolution, the U.S. Immigration Office provided visas freely to any Iranian who had money and wanted to come to the U.S. At that time, it also extended all visas issued to Iranians to September 1980 with no questions asked. Therefore, all the threats of indiscriminate mass deportation are nothing but hot air.

Rather than a blanket attack, the deportation order has a more specific target. It is aimed at the powerful Iran-

ian student movement which has been a leading force among third world students here in fighting the bourgeoisie. Through the deportation order and vicious harassment of Iranian students the monopoly capitalists hope to confuse and disintegrate the movement. The U.S. government will definitely try to deport the leadership of the Iranian Student Association (Confederation of Iranian Students) in order to crush the student movement and if they succeed, they can use the chauvinism and reaction stirred up to attack other third world students and people's in this country.

## U.S. Imperialism: The Real Violator Of State-to-State Relations

The U.S. government has repeatedly accused Iran of violating state-to-state relations and international law respecting foreign embassies. But it is the U.S. not Iran, who has again and again violated state-to-state relations and international law.

Why did the U.S. government let the Shah into the country in the first place? After all, the U.S. would not dare to officially invite the Dalai Lama, fearing to provoke the revisionist leadership in China, and the state department had

to consult the Italian Christian Democrat government before they issued a visa to the leader of the revisionist Italian Communist Party. Letting the Shah come in is a direct insult and provocation to the Iranian government, especially since the U.S. could have easily sent a team of doctors to Mexico to treat the Shah's cancer.

When the Iranian government justly requested the Shah be sent back to Iran for trial, the U.S. twisted the issue around, making it appear as if Iran wanted to humiliate the American people. If the U.S. government can extradite hijackers to Cuba, a country with no diplomatic relations with the U.S., then the U.S. can extradite the Shah, a mass murderer. It was the U.S. who violated international law in the first place by using the U.S. embassy in Iran as a spy center, staffed with CIA agents. It was after discovering documented evidence of direct U.S. involvement in the Kurdish rebellion and other attempts to undermine the Iranian government that Khomeini came out in full support of the student action.

## U.S. More Exposed Internationally

Internationally, although the U.S.

# Bourgeoisie's Anti-Iranian Chauvinist Bite Poisons Masses

## People's Anger Detoured from Real Enemy

Working class youth hanging out, most of them jobless, with little future under capitalism, are looking for a target to vent their anger and frustration. Everywhere they turn, the TV, newspapers and radio are blaring "Enough of this Khomeinia, Let's Do Something!" Although many of these youth do not care for the fascist Shah, they spontaneously latch on to the target. In Houston, demonstrators marched to the Iranian Consulate and burned an Iranian flag. In Portland, Oregon youth shouted, "Go home, dumb Iranians." At Fresno State University in California, students carried signs that read "Send in the Marines" and "Have a Happy Thanksgiving—Hold an Iranian Hostage."

The bourgeoisie has been steadily losing grip on the masses in the aftermath of Vietnam and Watergate. This is the first significant mass movement in the last 10 years that actively supported U.S. imperialism. The bourgeoisie tries to cash in on the issue, twisting it to focus on the hostages instead of the just demand of Iran for the return of the Shah to be tried as a criminal that he is. Sensationalizing the demonstrations and whipping up chauvinism, the bourgeoisie are directing the masses' frustration and anger away from themselves to Khomeini and Iranians, laying the ground for world war and fascism.

Carter, speaking to the AFL-CIO, summed up and said, "No act has so galvanized the American people toward unity in the last decade."

### Trade Union Bureaucrats Use Chauvinism to Straitjacket Workers' Struggle

Bureaucrats from different trade unions have also joined in to spread the chauvinist poison. AFL-CIO head George Meany called Khomeini a "madman" and proposed resolutions calling on the U.S. government to retaliate against Iran. Thomas Gleason, president of the International Longshoremen Association declared that the ILA will not load cargo bound for Iran. At Port Newark, N.J., 70 longshoremen refused to work on Iranian ships. The Transport Workers Union also refused to service Iranian aircraft.

These trade union bureaucrats are agents of the bourgeoisie in the ranks of the working class. As the working class rises up to toss out these hacks in local after local across the country, these bureaucrats revive their "bushel for a barrel" and "buy American" slogans to divert the target away from the bourgeoisie and themselves and straitjacket the working class into chauvinism and racism.

But the fact that some of the U.S. workers are swayed by this chauvinist trash reflects how deeply they are morally wounded by imperialism. Other than a small strata of labor aristocrats, the majority of the U.S. working class does not directly benefit from the superprofits the U.S. bourgeoisie gets from ripping off third world countries. But the imperialist ideology pushed by the labor aristocracy straitjackets the workers' struggle, holding them back from their emancipation.

### Bourgeoisie Tries to Hide Crisis

Carter is using the chauvinism that has been generated to *take on the appearance* of firm leadership. Unable to deal with the imperialist crisis, the U.S. working class sees that the bourgeoisie cannot rule in the old way. But Carter is trying to act tough, stopping Iranian oil imports, seizing all Iranian assets and pushing an investigation of all Iranian students in this country to deport them. His "strong leadership" means war mongering, chauvinism and racism. He gives a false sense of confidence in appearing to resolve the crisis. But he can't solve this deep rooted capitalist economic crisis nor get the U.S. imperialist back in Iran except through the same old imperialist way—by going to war.

### Shah: Thief and Butcher

Carter is focusing on the hostages, heating up feelings to "defend America." He accused the Iranian government of violating international law. But it is the U.S. government who violated this law by using the U.S. embassy as a spy center, by sticking its dirty hand in the Kurdish rebellion. It is the U.S. that time and time again violates state to state relations. If the U.S. will agree with Cuba—a country that it doesn't even have diplomatic relations with—to send back hijackers to be tried, why won't they send the Shah back to Iran?

The Shah is worse than any hijacker. He is a mass murderer, who tortured, maimed and murdered over 100,000 Iranians during his bloody rule. He is a despot landlord that owned 2,000 Iranian villages, 17 banks and insurance companies, 25 metal industries and 8 mining companies, including 25% of Krupp steel—the largest steel company in West Germany. He is a capitalist bloodsucker who owns 45% of GM in Iran and every hotel built in and around Teheran, who ripped off over \$8 billion from the blood and back-breaking sweat of the Iranian people.

### Bourgeoisie Prepares for World War and Fascism

Using slogans like "Don't tread on me" and "nuke Iran," the FBI in New York City pushed people to take out their frustrations on Iranians by spray-painting the address of the Iranian Student Association on the sidewalks. In Denver, Colorado, a band of youth threw rocks through the window of an Iranian's apartment, surrounding him on all sides. With his life on the line, he fired his gun, killing one of the attackers. For heroically defending himself, he was charged with first degree murder. TV stations and newspapers splashed across their front page how another American was "victimized" by Iranians. And in Minnesota, the state framed four Iranians for trying to kidnap the Governor. While the charges were later dropped for lack of evidence, it served the purpose of exciting the people and whipping up demonstrations on campuses against Iranians.

The bourgeoisie, treating Iranians like animals in an Old West roundup,

demanding that all Iranians in the U.S. turn themselves in to the Immigration Department to be investigated and deported. This is the same old fascist rule that Hitler used against Jews, Israel against Palestinians and South Africa against blacks.

### U.S. Imperialism Uses Spontaneous Demonstrations To Whip Up Chauvinism

ROTC and "Animal House" fraternity types stepped in to cash in on the issue. Holding old fashioned pep rallies, drinking beer and shouting racist slurs, they try to whip up a chauvinist "America first" attitude. Security guards and police actively promote this by stepping back and giving full play to the fist fights that break out. But the majority of students did not support the demonstrations. Even the parents of one of the hostages said, "If they want the Shah, send him back. He's a thief anyway."

At William Paterson College in Wayne, New Jersey the fascist tactic announced by the Immigration officials of rounding up the Iranian students had been opposed by the school's faculty union. The faculty has called on the college administration to deny information to immigration officials. Irwin Nack, president of the Teachers Union said, "That kind of action which attempts to punish a whole racial group regardless of their guilt or innocence can only result in murders like the recent Ku Klux Klan action in North Carolina or Nazi action in Germany."

**U.S. Working Class Awakening But Confused on Target**  
Why are the masses confused? One

demonstrator said, "We're against the KKK and Iranians." Facing unemployment, rising inflation and mindless culture, the masses are sick and tired of the dead end street of capitalism that grinds them down every day, every hour. Losing their illusions in the capitalist system, having no confidence that the bourgeoisie can get out of the crisis, the masses are fed up. They are lashing out at any target to vent their anger. Sometimes this target is clear and correct like at Levittown when the oil companies were fingered for the gas crisis; or when scum elements like the KKK and Nazis were hit in Dallas, Decatur and Tupelo. # Nelson Johnson, Other Comrades Framed—



## Turn the Upside Down Justice Around!

GREENSBORO, N.C.—He was covered from the shoulders down with blood drawn by a trained attacker with a knife. Yet Nelson Johnson, a member of the Communist Workers Party, angrily denounced the murders that had just taken place in front of the gathering crowd. As the KKK/Nazi and government assassins sped away, a mob of cops surged to grab Nelson. These cops knew where to hide when the bullets cut down five Communist Workers Party members, and they also knew that the people would listen to Nelson, who was well-known and respected in the projects.

Hoping to stem the growing anger of the people, the pigs tried to shut Comrade Nelson up and drag him off to jail. When Willena Cannon, a friend of the Party, came to his defense by grabbing him in a bear hug as they tried to pull him over a fence, she too was arrested. Nelson never stopped agitating until they slammed the doors on him.

Police reports were contradictory on why he was arrested, saying on the one hand that the charges of inciting to riot "happened prior to the shootings," (*Jersey Journal*, 11/5/79) and on the other hand Police Chief Swing stated that, "There were no law violations prior to the violence." (*Greensboro Daily News*, 11/5/79).

While some of the hired gunmen of the Klan, Nazi's and FBI remain loose, the arrests and framed up charges of inciting to riot against these staunch fighters for the people strengthens our will to turn the upside down justice around.

## Defend the Right of Armed Self-Defense

### DROP CHARGES ON THE 26 ARRESTED!

We have no illusions about the fascist heart beating in the breast of bourgeois democracy. The murder of our five comrades at the anti-Klan, anti-Nazi demonstration on November 3rd shows exactly why we must defend our right to armed self-defense.

That Saturday, the government disarmed us by passing a special ordinance specifically denying us the right to carry arms, even though this right is supposedly given by North Carolina law. Then they set us up for

the attack by giving the KKK/Nazi and government agents the starting point of the rally and not telling us that these scums knew. That Saturday, knowing that a KKK/Nazi caravan was headed for the rally, the Greensboro police didn't stop it and "mysteriously" disappeared just before the Nazi/KKK and government assassins opened fire. The police returned to that area only after these degenerates had gotten away and then they dared to arrest Nelson Johnson and other Communist

Workers Party comrades.

This is why we say turn this upside down capitalist justice around and drop the charges against Nelson and the other comrades. This is why we demand the right to armed self-defense. We are going to fight tooth and nail to defend the 26 comrades who were busted for possession of weapons hours before the Sunday burial march. They were trying to protect the march from the same kind of murderers that assassinated Jim, Cesar, Mike, Bill, and Sandy. □

# Stop FBI Harassment of the Communist Workers Party

After the federal government sent in the Klan, Nazis and a group of trained professional killers to assassinate five members of the Communist Workers Party on November 3rd, President Carter showed his "concern" by sending over 100 FBI agents to Greensboro two days later. Under the cover of "investigating the Klan," the monopoly capitalists are using the Communist Workers Party Five assassinations as a chance to launch a full scale, nationwide investigation and harassment campaign against Communist Workers Party members and workers around us. This is just a continuation of what the government has been doing all along.

The local FBI stated in the Greensboro press on November 2 that they had just completed a thorough investigation of the Communist Workers Party comrades in Greensboro. Since then, the FBI in conjunction with the local Red Squad (a special police unit aimed at communists) has tailed workers and Communist Workers Party members, tapped phones, made threatening phone calls, visited homes and asked for identification without any cause. During the week before the November 11 funeral march for the Communist Workers Party Five, an FBI agent tried to run a carload of Party members off the road while they were leaving Durham, North Carolina. Also, one comrade came home and found two FBI agents in suit and tie, one black, one white, trying to unlock the front door of the house.

## How the Bourgeoisie Uses The State to Attack Communists

This is exactly how the bourgeoisie uses the state to attack communists who are organizing the workers for proletarian revolution. First, they legally try to strip communists and workers of the right of armed self-defense. This was the purpose of the local injunction against the use of arms by the Communist Workers Party at the Saturday, November 3rd anti-Klan demonstration, as well as the State of Emergency before the funeral march. Then the bourgeoisie sent in its SWAT Team with the KKK and Nazis to assassinate the Communist Workers Party Five. Next, under the cover of "investigating the KKK to prevent further violence," the monopoly capitalists sent in the FBI to investigate the real fighters of the working class—the Communist Workers Party.

## FBI's Purpose—Assassinate Revolutionary Fighters

The FBI and other law enforcement agencies have always served one purpose—to assassinate those fighting the bourgeoisie. There is well-documented evidence of the role the FBI played in infiltrating the Black Panther Party and causing shoot outs among groups in the Black Liberation Movement in the late 60's. J. Edgar Hoover ordered agents to infiltrate anti-Vietnam War protests in order to collect information, spread poisonous slander and cause fights between different protest groups. It is a known fact that Hoover ordered a slanderous tape be sent to Mrs. Martin Luther King to discredit Dr. King.

The FBI, the local Red Squad and

the Chicago police murdered Fred Hampton while asleep in his Chicago apartment. This year, a low-life scum named Gary Rowe publicly announced that as an FBI agent he infiltrated the KKK in the 60's and set up the murder of Mrs. Viola Liuzzo, who was driving from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama to pick up some freedom marchers.

The bourgeoisie's use of professional assassins, the FBI and the Nazi/KKK to murder and intimidate the Communist Workers Party has failed. The November 3rd massacre was a test of the Party. Instead of going underground or getting trapped into bourgeois legalism, the Party is turning grief into strength by pushing out more vigorously

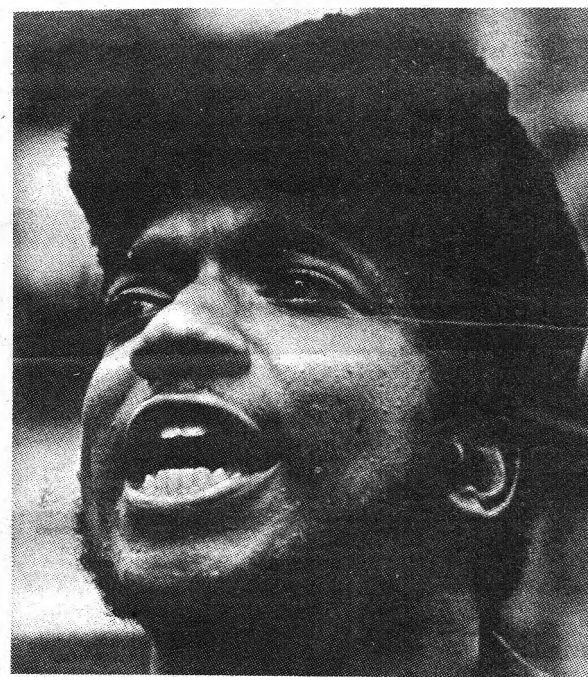
than ever before our preparation for the dictatorship of the proletariat.

Despite the FBI, CIA, Red Squad and local police, the murder of the Communist Workers Party Five has welded the Party more firmly both ideologically and politically. In one city, comrades were walking and heard some noise in a bush. They pulled the bush back and an FBI agent was sitting there listening to his walkie talkie. When he saw the comrades, his face turned white in fear and he scurried off. Several other comrades were being tailed by the FBI. They turned around and took the agent's picture. This cowardly dog ran away with his walkie talkie bouncing in his suit pocket. Minutes later when he

looked through his rearview mirror, he saw our comrades right on his bumper. With frightened, bugged out eyes, he sped off like the sewer rat he is.

Workers all across the country are stepping forward, pledging to fulfill the Communist Workers Party Five Enrollment. The CWP 5 murders have made one thing clear to the workers—that the government and the police had to be involved in order to carry out such a thorough murder of the Party's leadership. As one worker stated, "the Klan doesn't work in broad daylight. The police had to be involved." □

## New FBI Charter: Bourgeoisie Steps Up Attacks on Workers and Communists

Under the guise of "reforming" the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the new FBI charter presently in the Senate Judiciary Committee is another step by the bourgeoisie to grant its repressive arm more powers to assassinate, intimidate and infiltrate progressive and revolutionary movements. It shows the thorough fear and dying desperation of the bourgeoisie as it prepares for stepped up resistance from workers and the Communist Workers Party.

The proposed charter gives the FBI the broad powers "to conduct an investigation on the basis of facts or circumstances that reasonably indicate that a person has engaged, is engaged, or will engage" in so-called criminal activity. The charter is so broad that it covers workers on the picket line to the right of armed self-

defense. The FBI can launch an investigation for the most flimsy reason.

Teddy Kennedy, one of the most sinister liberal politicians, gave his full approval. He said the new charter "symbolizes the fact that the Bureau has learned from its mistakes, has identified the causes of these errors and has come forward with a charter which contains provisions which will insure that the chronicled abuses and failures of the past will not be repeated in the future."

The FBI will have the authority to get credit and bank records of anyone they feel should be under investigation. It states the FBI can continue electronic surveillance, burglaries and wiretaps. All FBI informers can break any law while serving the Bureau, and the informers' identity

can not be revealed—"In no event may a court order an attorney for the Government or any other official of the Department of Justice to disclose the identity of a confidential informant." No victims of FBI attacks, even if the FBI violates its own charter, will be allowed to sue "any officer, agent, or employee or former U.S. government."

Running like shivering cowards, trying to keep their rule, the bourgeoisie is in a frenzy. They know the growing spontaneous resistance of the working class and the deepening leadership of the Communist Workers Party has them caught between a rock and a hard place. The new FBI charter represents the bourgeoisie's weakness. It's a dying gasp of a dying class. □

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### Sandy 'Fought And Died For What She Believed'

The possibility of the Ku Klux Klan terrorizing young black children would move Sandra Smith to tears.

So last weekend in Greensboro, when Klan members sprayed shots into a "Death to the Klan" rally she helped organize, she hustled youngsters at the housing project to a nearby building for safety.

Then she peeped around the corner of the building and was shot between the eyes.

Most college revolutionaries of the early 1970s left their ideologies behind after graduation.

Sandra Smith did not. If anything, her ideas after graduating from Bennett College in Greensboro in 1973 became more radical. Her desire to spend her life fighting repression of blacks and the poor led to union organizing and civil rights work and, by 1977, communism.

Swayed by the philosophy of people like Greens-

## Rights Leaders Troubled by Prospect of Leftist Gains Among Blacks

The killing of five members of the Communist Workers Party by purported members of the Ku Klux Klan earlier this month has posed a quandary for black civil rights activists.

They are fearful that the killings might provide Communist groups with a foothold among poor, Southern blacks whom they have not been successful in recruiting over the years. At the same time, most civil rights activists are also reluctant to appear less militant on black issues than anyone else in competing for the loyalties of blacks.

So civil rights figures are moving with extreme caution in their public reactions to the incident in Greensboro, N.C., taking care to condemn the violence without implying support for Communism.

"I'm frightened," said an official of the Raleigh, N.C., chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, "because they obviously can no longer be written off as 'outside, white-led radicals' — their blood has been spilled in this state and in a black neighborhood by white racists."

### 'We Have Enough Problems'

The Rev. George Lawrence, pastor of Brooklyn's Antioch Baptist Church of Christ, maintained that the Communist activists posed a danger because "they complicate the whole civil rights stance and the thrust for human rights — we have enough problems as blacks and we don't need to provoke any more."

Mr. Lawrence was in Detroit for the first meeting of the Black Pastors Conference, a group said to represent church membership of more than 10 million. A delegation of ministers from Greensboro led black clergymen from Baptist, Methodist and Pentecostal denominations in forming a group to find ways of responding to Communist organizing efforts.

In discussions among the pastors in Detroit, at the N.A.A.C.P.'s state confer-

ence in Greensboro, and at an emergency meeting in Raleigh last Saturday of the North Carolina Black Leadership Caucus, the focus was on the dangers of what many termed the Communist Workers Party's "baiting" of the Klan and on how the group's efforts had made the poor, black neighborhood of Morningside Heights a battleground two weekends ago.

The civil rights leaders who assert that they must not appear less militant than Communist organizers are further disturbed that one of the Communist Workers Party's leaders is Nelson Johnson, long a prominent black activist in the Greensboro area.

These were some of the black responses to the shootings:

¶The North Carolina Black Leadership Caucus has urged that the state's civil rights and black political groups give top priority to promoting voter education and registration among blacks, especially in poorer areas, to provide evidence of tangible gains.

¶Five groups, four of them black, last week announced a meeting in Atlanta for Dec. 14 and 15 to formulate strategies for "actively dealing with the Klan," as a result of the killings in Greensboro. The announcement did not mention the Communist Workers Party. The groups involved in the meeting are the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, the Center for Constitutional Rights, the Division of Church and Society of the National Council of Churches, the National Conference of Black Lawyers, and the Interreligious Foundation for Community Organization.

¶The Rev. Jesse L. Jackson, leader of a Chicago-based group called People United to Save Humanity, issued an eight-paragraph statement condemning the violence, without mentioning the Communist Workers Party. The president of the National Urban League, Vernon E. Jordan Jr., took a similar approach in speeches in New York and Detroit.

¶The North Carolina N.A.A.C.P., meeting in Greensboro the day the Communist Workers Party had a funeral there for the slain protesters, held a brief memorial service for the dead but did not join in the funeral procession.

The funeral service, said Dr. Nell Irvin Painter, a history professor at the University of North Carolina, was aimed at appealing to blacks, with a gospel chorus singing freedom songs.

### Black Slogans at Funeral

Dr. Painter, co-author of the recently published book, "The Narrative of Hosea Hudson: His Life as a Negro Communist

in the South," noted that the ceremony had been attended by a "surprisingly large number of blacks" and had used slogans and expressions of the civil rights movement, black churches and the Black Panther Party.

"This group will probably start to compete for black loyalties with the N.A.A.C.P., the churches, et cetera, even though whites are involved," Dr. Painter said, "because blacks will now say the whites were willing to lay down their lives." Four of the five Greensboro vic-

tims were white.

Most black civil rights activists declined to predict the Communists' prospects for success among blacks, but all agreed that the killings had greatly increased the leftists' potential for recruiting blacks.

They noted, however, that Communist attempts at organizing blacks had failed before, in great part because the Communists present discrimination against blacks as rooted in class conflict, not racial prejudice.

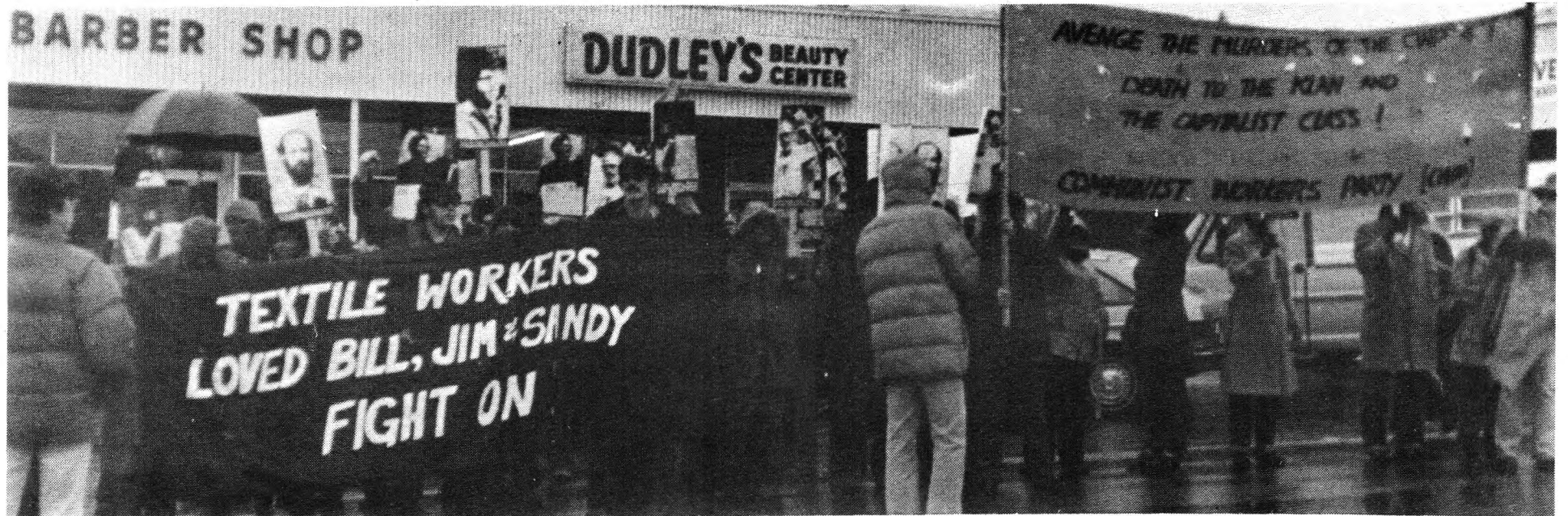
### Silent as the Graves

The murder of five communist demonstrators by Klan and Nazi gangsters has been greeted circumspectly by what passes for the American left. Though the spectacle of fascism running wild ought to evoke unhappy memories among liberals, most remain unseen and unheard. They are content to let consensus reign, in this case the notion (suggested by Anthony Lewis in a disgraceful column) that the Communist Workers Party brought the hail of bullets down upon itself by its "provocative" behaviour. This leads to a gruesome state of affairs: the Times mildly chastises the Greensboro police for lack of vigilance, while those same cops whisper that the comics really fired the first shot. Eventual acquittal of the guilty men seems likely, which will naturally encourage other white supremacist murderers, cross-burners and their kind.

Four of those killed were union activists. Three had organized workers in the Cone textile mills to fight for better conditions with the Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union, and another, Cesar Cauce, was trying to organize Duke Medical Center workers into the Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees at the time of his murder. Their political views were antagonistic to those of the unions' leaders—who incidentally call themselves socialists—which may be why the labor statesmen haven't bothered to exorcise the killers or those who let the slaughter be done.

Dignity would at least have required labor and its liberal allies to issue some proclamation of grief, some demand for justice if not revenge. Courage would demand issuance of a call for anti-fascist demonstrations in every major city—like the one sponsored by the Spartacists in Detroit. But our liberals are too busy with Teddy, and labor is getting ready to elevate Lane Kirkland as Meany's successor. Action against native fascism is left in the hands of the Trotskyists and other sectarians, who at least can understand the meaning of murder when they see it. For liberals, it's much more stimulating to dump on the Iranians.





Communists Workers Party martyrs Jim, Bill and Sandy were communist mass leaders, deeply and inseparably rooted among the textile workers. They were a nightmare to Cone Mills which tried every vicious way to get them out of the plants, but this only made their reputation and ties with the masses stronger.

## JIM, BILL, SANDY: Nightmares to Cone Mills, Heroes to Textile Workers

**Cone Mills, Granite Finishing Plant, Haw River, N.C.:** "It's hard to believe Blackbeard's really gone. Me, I got a .45 waiting at home for whoever it was shot him. I keep expecting to see him out here selling his newspaper or calling us all out to a meeting or something. The workers know who's behind this thing. My supervisor even came up and said he had never heard Blackbeard say an untrue thing. That's probably to keep us cooled out, because they know how we all felt about him down here."

**Cone Mills, White Oak Plant:** "The night after Bill and the other workers were killed, Cone sent us all home early. This place is like a volcano about to erupt. Cone didn't know what to expect at shift change. The workers were about to walk out. We've all seen Cone call the Greensboro cops and had them come in here and drag out anybody who dared to stand up to the boss, just like they came in and dragged out Bill last year. But he was quite a fighter. The next week, he was back, fighting just as hard. They've had the FBI in here all week, walking around, checking us all out, trying to make sure we're good and scared. But I think they're the ones that's good and scared. It wouldn't surprise a lot of us if it was Cone who told the cops who to make sure was shot."

**Cone Mills, Revolution Plant, Greensboro, N.C.:** "If you ask me, Cone is acting like they have a damned guilty conscience. The supervisors are spreading rumors about the CWP folks who work here. The tension is so thick you can cut it with a knife. Cone hated Sandy and we loved her. They tried to fire her for years, just like they fired some of the other people who were working for the union. Even though people are scared to talk, they know a set-up when they see one, and they are pretty sure Cone must have had a hand in this."

### Workers Love the Party's Leadership, Bourgeoisie Hate It

In the past few years the Communist Workers Party (formerly Workers Viewpoint Organization) has become deeply and inseparably rooted among the textile workers, Greensboro's largest industry. With the steel-edged guidance of the Party's line, in a short time the Party swept through the main mills, building up the working class leadership, filling the void in leadership with a communist storm. The bourgeoisie, including Cone, the largest textile owner in the Greensboro area, and the labor aristocrat hacks cannot sleep for the desperation they feel everyday from this storm. This is why the workers love the Party's leadership and fighting spirit, and the monopoly capitalists hate it. While the capitalist media is spreading disgusting lies that the Party planned and wanted to martyr some comrades, who really stood to gain from their murder? The bourgeoisie stood to gain, including Cone, in their desperation to find some way out of their crisis and stop the class awakening, and the growth and strengthening of its leadership, the Party.

It is no accident that three of the five Communist Workers Party com-

rades gunned down by the bourgeoisie's assassins were rooted in Cone Mills and were recognized communist mass leaders of the working class. For it is here that their profound grasp of the Party's line becomes magnified a hundredfold, as they fought alongside workers at the point of production, developing advanced workers into communists who endlessly took up the task of building up the Party, preparing for the dictatorship of the proletariat. But the bourgeoisie's attacks on the workers and their leaders, which have been happening ever since the Communist Workers Party began contending for leadership and power are now part of a new stepped-up wave. This only blows away workers' illusions about capitalism's true nature, and are turned into a greater offensive by the Party and the class.

### Communist Workers Party CC Member Jim Waller Challenged Cone's Exploitation

When Comrade Jim Waller began to work at Cone Mills Granite plant, he led struggles around safety conditions like working in 120° temperatures (July '77) and providing decent handtrucks for workers to handle 500 lb. cloth rolls (March '78). From working together on the line to cutting tobacco and slaughter-

ing pigs together in the fields, Jim's humbleness, willingness to learn from his mistakes and clear stand with the workers against the company won him the friendship and respect of workers plantwide. He was rebaited, threatened and called a "nigger-lover" time and time again by the Cone management and the few backward workers. But Jim stood firm and openly on his communist principles, and persisted in struggling to forge the unity of black and white workers through organizing their fight.

In the summer of '78, Jim led an explosive strike against Cone's attack on wages. This strike was the blossoming of the respect and leadership that the Party's line and Jim's work had won over a 2-year period. Then Cone and the union lackeys fired him because they stood in fear of his deep influence among the workers. But again Jim and the workers only came back fighting ten times harder.

Workers at Granite, most of them from rural sharecropper and tenant farming roots, saw in Jim a genuine concern and love for the masses that went far beyond all the rebaiting, lies and attacks that the company could mount. This is why even after the company had defeated the strike, and the ACTWU (Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union) misleaders and Cone had conspired to fire Jim, the union members elected him president. And even after having been out of the plant for 1½ years, Jim and his wife could sell over 60 copies of the *Workers Viewpoint* newspaper at the Granite gate at one shift change.

### At Cone's White Oak: Tremendous Rank & File Fighting Capacity

White Oak is Cone's largest and highest profit plant, and the one in which the communist-led rank and file movement is the deepest rooted. For several years Workers Viewpoint Organization comrades and supporters have been leading shop-floor struggles around Cone's rotten conditions and slave-like treatment of workers. When comrade Bill Sampson got a job in the Dye House, the worst sweatshop at White Oak, workers immediately were drawn to his quiet but determined stand against Cone's management. He persistently and

forthrightly put out communist politics, winning workers by his example as well as his ideas. Bill's roots among the workers spread and deepened as people saw concretely what communism meant through Bill.

The White Oak Organizing Committee (WOOC) led by Bill and other workers close to the Communist Workers Party became a force inside the weak ACTWU local by fighting the company's attacks while pressuring the old sold-out ACTWU hacks to take a stand with the workers. At the time the Party began work at White Oak, the union had 15 members out of 2,200 workers. The WOOC forged a firm network of fighting shop stewards in every department. In the autumn of 1977, when Cone fired five people in a massive attack against the rank and file, the White Oak Organizing Committee, under the Party's leadership, won most of those jobs back with full back pay. The Committee used the grievance procedure for everything it was worth, and when the WOOC dissolved itself in the fall of 1978, it was because the Organizing Committee basically was the union and the shop stewards committee, so a separate form was unnecessary.

The rank and file put forth a slate of fighters for the union elections in February of 1979, which was headed by Bill Sampson, nominated for union president and was clearly destined to win. But the ACTWU bureaucrats were as threatened as Cone by the prospect of having a fighting rank and file union led by communists in the White Oak Plant. Their days of a sweetheart, do-nothing union were numbered. They tried everything to disqualify the rank and file slate from the elections—from falsifying dues records to lying on membership roles. The Party and the workers fought back tit for tat and as a last resort, 10 days before the election, the ACTWU International slapped the union into receivership, reinstating all the old hack leadership and suspending the elections.

In the face of these attacks, the rank and file at White Oak under the Party's leadership fought Cone even harder, and more and more workers are trained and drawn into the Party. This is the deep-rooted history the

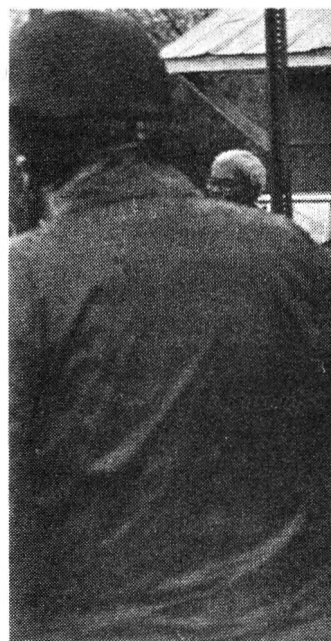

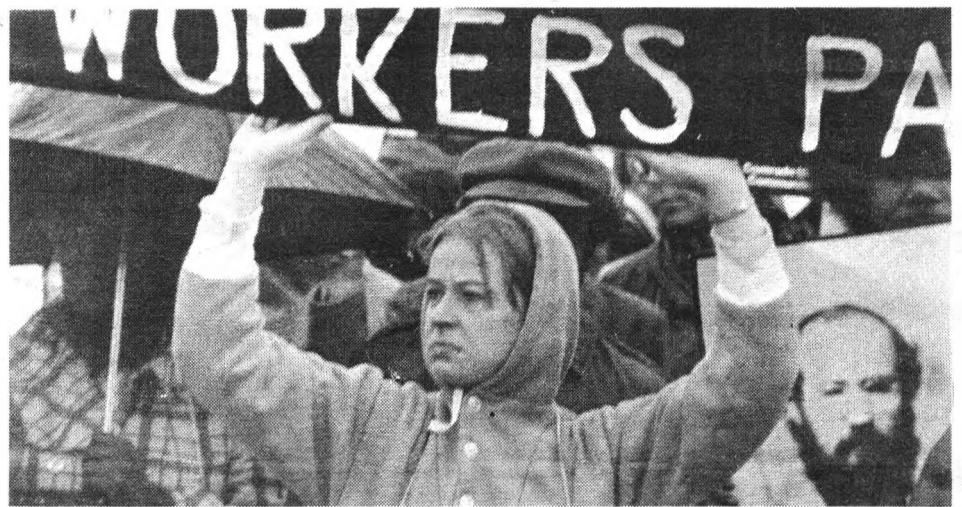

Party's organizing of Cone Mill workers represents, flying in the face of Cone and the state's efforts to label the Communist Workers Party as "infiltrators" and outsiders.

## A Fighting Chance At Revolution

"To me, the Party represents a fighting chance. Everybody always said, since I came to Cone, Cone can't be beat, so stop fighting it! The Party taught me different. We've made some mistakes, but we've done our share of putting the company on the run."

When Sandy Smith was elected Chairperson of the Revolution Organizing Committee (ROC) in 1976, workers came out in full force for a union drive under the leadership of the Workers Viewpoint Organization (see *WV*, May 1977). The ROC represented new hope for the workers at Cones' historically "can't be organized" mill, Revolution. Throughout the next two years, under Sandy's militant, uncompromising chairmanship and the leadership of the Communist Workers Party the ROC became the union at Revolution. In spite of the ACTWU's refusal to recognize the Committee and organize at Revolution, workers there filed the first grievances ever filed under Cone's sham grievance procedure. The Revolution Organizing Committee fought firings and harassment, exposed conditions and safety hazards at Revolution, and helped organize a union drive at Cone's Eno plant in nearby Hillsboro. The Committee called in the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) to expose dangerous chemical conditions at Revolution, fought layoffs, stretchouts, and job combinations. The ROC took Cone to court. After two years of stalling by Cone and the Labor Board, the workers finally won back the jobs of two Organizing Committee members fired on trumped-up charges for unionizing activities. In the course of the case, the workers and the Communist Workers Party exposed Cone's vicious union-busting and collaboration

with the cops against the rank and file organizing.

To workers at Revolution who knew and respected Sandy as a friend, co-worker and leadership of the ROC, it was clear why Cone hated her. It is also clear why Cone wants workers like Sandy and others under the leadership of the Communist Workers Party out of the mill. The Organizing Committee was an example to the workers that with unity and leadership the workers have a fighting chance even against huge companies like Cone—and that the ACTWU hacks only block efforts at genuinely fighting the company.

## CWP Shaking Cone, Cops and FBI Stranglehold

The work of the Communist Workers Party at Cone Mills, particularly through the lives of these three comrades has been the leading edge of the class struggle in the textile industry for four years. Jim, ACTWU Local 1113-T president at a Cone Mills plant, Bill ten days away from being ACTWU Local 1391 president at the largest Cone Mills plant, and Sandy, past president and respected leader of the rank and file organizing committee at still another Cone plant, were shining examples the proletariat loved and nightmares the bourgeoisie, especially Cone, hated.

Both Cone and the ACTWU hacks have been exposed, defeated and humiliated by the workers under the Party's leadership. In spite of Cone's close ties with the Greensboro cops and North Carolina state troopers who have been called out time and again to control and intimidate workers, and in the case of the Granite strike to provide protection for scabs and management, the workers have been on a political offensive, led by the Party. This is why the Cone-controlled Greensboro press has had to promote stories around "infiltration of communists who 'targeted' Cone Mills" to try to discredit the growing communist-led workers movement.

This is why the ACTWU bureaucrats have tangled themselves up in their

own lies, saying on the one hand that the receivership slapped on the Cone locals last spring was *not* "To avoid WVO sympathizers gaining control of the relatively weak local chapters" while in the same article, "Spokesmen for the international union said at the time dissidents had taken control of 1391 and other locals and were not representing the interests of the 4,000 Cone workers." (*Greensboro Daily News*, 11/6/79,

been especially close in the South. The FBI has reported they completed "an investigation of the background and activities of the North Carolina WVO on Friday, one day before the shootings." (*Greensboro Daily News*, 11/6/79 p. A17). Then why, a day after the murders, did the FBI make a statement that they "had no information about the party."? (*New York Times*, 11/5/79) This blatant coverup is only

p. A17). All over the country, these same hacks try to fool people into believing they are *really* organizing with their so-called J.P. Stevens campaign. While all the time, they are doing no real organizing, only using textile workers' suffering and blocking their anger, and all they're really organizing is a pure media hype.

The web of lies and intimidation woven by Cone and the state agencies, the cops, SBI, FBI is beginning to trip them up. When workers came out of the mills last week before the funeral march on Sunday, they were confronted by cops and state troopers. And at White Oak on Thursday and Friday, workers coming out at shift change faced mounted police.

Cone's ties with the local pigs are clear and known to the workers as a day to day threat. Historically, the ties between the FBI and local police have

evidence of what is otherwise obvious—that government agents instigated the Klan attack. And there is no contradiction for Cone Mills, a relatively smaller monopoly capitalist, to be hooked up with the FBI or CIA. The FBI and CIA like the capitalist class are not monolithic institutions totally under Rockefeller or Morgan. Different areas and departments are influenced by different monopolies, depending on what's their interests. Cone's constant attacks against the Communist Workers Party comrades only made the workers hate Cone more. And the brutal assassinations of these proletarian leaders have fired the workers who knew and loved them with a new and deeper resolve to link up with the Party and turn the country upside down to avenge the Communist Workers Party Five. □

was able to temporarily twist the issue and narrow the question to that of U.S. hostages, the tit-for-tat struggle between Iran and the U.S. has exposed the imperialists more.

The Iranian government's announcement to withdraw its \$12 billion dollar assets held in the U.S. caught the imperialist thieves red-handed. The U.S. had secretly and informally frozen Iranian assets since the Shah's overthrow, trying to undermine the revolution. The Iranian government knew this and its move to withdraw its assets forced the U.S. to publicly formalize this robbery. Dr. Sadegh Ghotbzadeh, a member of the Revolutionary Council, said the American move showed, "that laws are made only for the interests of the United States and it breaks them when it feels that it will be hurt."

The U.S. freeze on Iranian assets was condemned by many third world peoples and countries. The Palestinian Liberation Organization, Libya and Jordan denounced the U.S., and the director of the Union of Arab Chambers of Commerce made it clear that this move will hurt U.S.-Arab economic relations and weaken the OPEC count-

boro communist Nelson Johnson, Sandy, as most of her acquaintances knew her, came to believe violent revolution was the only way to put the country in the hands of the working class.

She was 28 when she died Saturday, one of five Communist Workers Party members killed in the Greensboro shoot-out.

Today — over protests from her parents — the party will carry her body through Greensboro streets.

Sandy Smith was an only child. Her parents kept her close to home in Piedmont, S.C., earning her the reputation of a "homebody." She was quiet and withdrawn, early childhood friends say.

Sandy regularly attended St. Matthews Baptist Church where her father, Smith Neely, was a deacon and her mother, Leola, served as church clerk. Neely is a millworker at a J.P. Stevens textile plant. Mrs.



Neely is a fifth-grade teacher at Baker's Chapel Elementary in near-by Greenville, S.C.

Even growing up, Sandy "wasn't no sometimey person," says Willie Pepper Jr., a church deacon. "Whatever she believed, she said."

He said that once after her high school graduation, she told a group of blacks who supported school desegregation that white students should integrate all-black Sterling High School rather than black students integrating a white school.

At that time and in that crowd, the idea was revolutionary, Pepper said.

From 1969 to 1973, Sandy attended Bennett College, maintaining a B-plus average. In her senior year, she was president of the student body and helped form a national black student group, Youth Organization of Black Unity.

Bennett College President Isaac Miller remembers Sandy as an organizer and a planner who tutored low-income children.

After college, she stayed in Greensboro. There, she met Nelson Johnson, the leader of a communist group. She married Mark Smith in November 1975 and, though it is unclear whether he is a communist, he gave permission for her body to be carried in today's march.

Sandy's communist alliance has shocked family and friends in Piedmont.

## 'This Is Too Far'

"I didn't know my daughter was involved in this," Mrs. Neely said. "I knew she was always caring for people working in the Y and things like that. But this is too far over. You can't change the world overnight."

In her efforts to fight capitalism, Sandy chaired an organization that attempted to unionize Cone Mill's Revolution plant in Greensboro, where she worked for four years. The Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union refused to support the group because of its communist leanings, so the push for a union never came to a vote.

But Sandy, an apprentice loom

fixer at Cannon Mills in Kannapolis at her death did a lot of leg-work in an unfair labor practice case against Cone Mills, according to officials at the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB). The suit ended in a September NLRB decision that the mill reinstate, with back pay, two men the company had fired because of union activity.

Sandy participated in nonviolent rallies against the Klan or for the Wilmington 10 and Charlotte 3.

Those who took part in labor and civil rights movements with her say Sandy was intense and dedicated.

Very seldom would her conversation stray from the "movement" and the need to get working people involved in change.

## Life Was Serious

"I can't ever remember sitting down and joking with her," said the Rev. James Barnett of Charlotte, a friend of two years and fellow activist.

"She was so dedicated, I didn't know if there was any socializing in her life."

"And when she talked, well, she could get up and speak like a fiery Baptist preacher, yelling and waving her hands."

In a Barnett-organized march July 7, marching 5 miles in cold, driving rain from Beatties Ford Road to downtown Charlotte, Sandy's "Ban the Klan" chants inspired the 25 marchers.

"She hollered so much, her nose was running," said Malik Tillman, also in the march.

"She talked about how the Klan would have a devastating impact on the kids in the future. The expression on her face was that she was willing to die to save the children. Tears were coming out of her eyes. That sister was sincere."

Tillman, who is not a communist, said he believed many beliefs

Sandy espoused "were indoctrinated in her. She really didn't have time to stop and think for herself. She didn't realize there are other alternatives instead of communism, putting herself on the line like that."

"The same reason the Wilmington 10 and Charlotte 3 are in jail today is the same reason the Klan is on the rise," she said during the Charlotte rally.

"This system has to be destroyed. The buildings here downtown — Cameron-Brown, Jefferson Tower — have to be put in the hands of the people who walk in the rain. The capitalistic system has to be destroyed and the institution of socialism be put in power."

On the days before the anti-Klan rally in Greensboro, Sandy telephoned people across the state asking them to participate. Barnett was one of the people she called. He says he was unable to make it because of work.

"I can see how Sandy died," said Barnett. "She was always right up front. You've got to give her credit. She fought and died for what she believed."

Residents of the Greensboro housing project where the shooting occurred feel respect but no pity for her.

"She was a leader of the movement, so she should have known what she was doing," said more than one person the day after the shooting.

And according to Charles Finch, a member of the communist group, Sandy knew full well what she was doing.

"I think what she recognized is the greater risk that our children and our families will continue to live in this society," he said. "I think every step of the way she was making a very deliberate decision to fight for the people."

ries commitment to the U.S. dollar. The announcement of the Iranian withdrawal of its assets also sent the currency market into chaos and the U.S. dollar dropped sharply, showing how vulnerable it is.

Iran called for a UN Security Council meeting and the U.S. blocked it. The main reason the U.S. imperialist was able to do this was because the Soviet Union and its satellite—Czechoslovakia—as well as the revisionist leadership of China sided with them. The Soviet imperialist supported the U.S. for fear that they would face the same fate, just like one thief covering up for another thief to protect himself. The Chinese revisionist leadership fell right in line with the U.S., having long ago abandoned the principle of supporting the third world's fight against both superpowers and relying now instead on the U.S. superpower to fight the Soviet Union.

The four second world countries in the Security Council, Britain, France, Norway and Portugal, were bullied into supporting the U.S. In private, at least one country complained about the U.S. high-handed tactics of setting preconditions and demanding the release of the hostages before any meeting could be called.

The five non-aligned Security Council members were confused by the hostages question. However, they made it

clear to Iran that they were opposed to preconditions for a Council meeting. But, they said, it would be in Iran's interest to resolve the hostage question before a meeting was held.

"There is nothing in the west except crime and treason—I don't mean the nations but the governments . . . They commit crimes, they don't allow the Security Council to meet, lead Iran astray and like thieves, loot and freeze," Khomeini told his people. That's a precise and accurate characterization of the criminal U.S. imperialists.

## Iran Gaining More Support World-Wide

The Palestinian Liberation Organization, who took the initiative at the beginning to mediate for the freeing of U.S. hostages, has now turned around. The strong and broad support among the Palestinians for the Iranian demand stirred sharp internal struggle within the PLO and forced to change its position. Arafat pledged the PLO's facilities at "the service of the Iranian revolutionaries under the leadership of Iman Khomeini" on November 15. The PLO also sharply criticized the U.S. and NATO naval maneuvers near Iranian territorial waters and called Carter's decision to freeze Iran's assets "dangerous and illegal."

Libya, America's second largest

source of foreign oil, said on November 15, it would not replace the U.S. oil losses caused by Iran's decision to halt sales to American companies. The Libyan government denounced the freeze on Iranian assets as an act of international terrorism and demanded joint reprisals by Arab countries.

Iran is gaining more support worldwide instead of being isolated as the U.S. had hoped. The tactic of appealing to the U.N. for a meeting and an international investigation of the Shah's crimes, and the release of women and black hostages will win greater support

among the third world countries and peoples. The tactic of inviting representatives from Western European countries to visit the hostages and witness the evidence of U.S. spying activities and documents also helps to win support among the second world countries. This increasing support will not only help to create favorable international public opinion for Iran but their victory will also help the struggle of oppressed peoples around the world, including U.S. workers, by weakening their common enemy—U.S. imperialism. □

The marchers were determined to provide a fitting burial for Jim, Cesar, Mike, Bill and Sandy—at any cost. It showed in their voices as they sang, “We’ve got to hold up the bloodstained banner.” And most of all it showed in their faces, full of class hatred and disdain, glaring at the long lines of local, state and federal police and National Guardsmen flanking the procession.

## Party’s Political Offensive Corners State

The government’s helplessness in stopping the march showed how backed into a corner it was from the very start.

Immediately after the 5 comrades were gunned down at the November 3 anti-Klan rally, Party members and friends stepped forward to take up the banner of the murdered five. Right on the spot, the deep sorrow of the four widows, Signe Waller, Flores Cauce, Marty Nathan and Dale Sampson, became burning hatred. One by one they began agitating over the bodies of their husbands and comrades in arms, linking the Nazi/KKK scum with the government and criminal capitalist system that breeds these hooded, swastika-wearing degenerates.

Their tears turned into powerful indictments against the bourgeoisie and the crowd of community residents that gathered around knew it was all true. “Long Live the Communist Workers Party!” shouted Signe Waller.

## Cone, Shaking with Fear, Closes Mill Early

Agitation teams, led by the widows, hit the gates of the textile mills where Jim, Bill, and Sandy had worked, getting the word out to the workers how the three had died and what they died for. The workers crowded around them, glad to see that under the Party’s lead, new fighters were taking Jim, Bill, and Sandy’s place. So afraid were the bosses of the Cone Mills that they had to shut down the White Oak Mill, where Bill had

worked, early the day after the killings. Knowing that the three had deep ties with their fellow workers, the Cone bosses panicked and called in state troopers and National Guardsmen to guard the plant gates. On the mill floor foremen carried shotguns. And the same thing was going on all over North Carolina and the whole country. Posters to avenge the Communist Workers Party 5 (CWP 5) went up throughout the country, announcing the funeral march in Greensboro.

## Government Declared: “State of Emergency” for the Burial of Our Comrades—the CWP 5

The bourgeoisie tried their best to block the masses from pouring out to join the march. First the Greensboro

Mayor tried to stop the march, saying no permit would be given. When that didn’t work, he backed off, saying that a burial march didn’t need a permit. Throughout the week, the police and the media were threatening people to stay home for their “safety.” FBI agents swarmed all over the North Carolina A & T campus and the Morningside black community, knocking on doors to scare people into not turning out for the march. They made a special effort to visit mill workers to try to intimidate them. All week long helicopters patrolled over the poor and Afro-American communities in both Greensboro and nearby Durham.

The Party countered with a militant warning to the bourgeoisie: If the Nazis/KKK come within 25 yards of the pro-

cession the government must take the most serious consequences of what happens to the Nazis/Klan. The Communist Workers Party will not permit another Saturday massacre, and will see to it that it never happens a second time.

The bourgeoisie set up a whole apparatus to try to deal with the march. They pulled together a central command at the local pig headquarters with every city, state, and federal law enforcement agency, along with the National Guard, working together. They held daily press conferences, quoting “unnamed sources,” to mislead and confuse the masses. The Mayor of Greensboro was so scared that he was up for 5 days straight and had a nervous breakdown, taking two whole days to recover.

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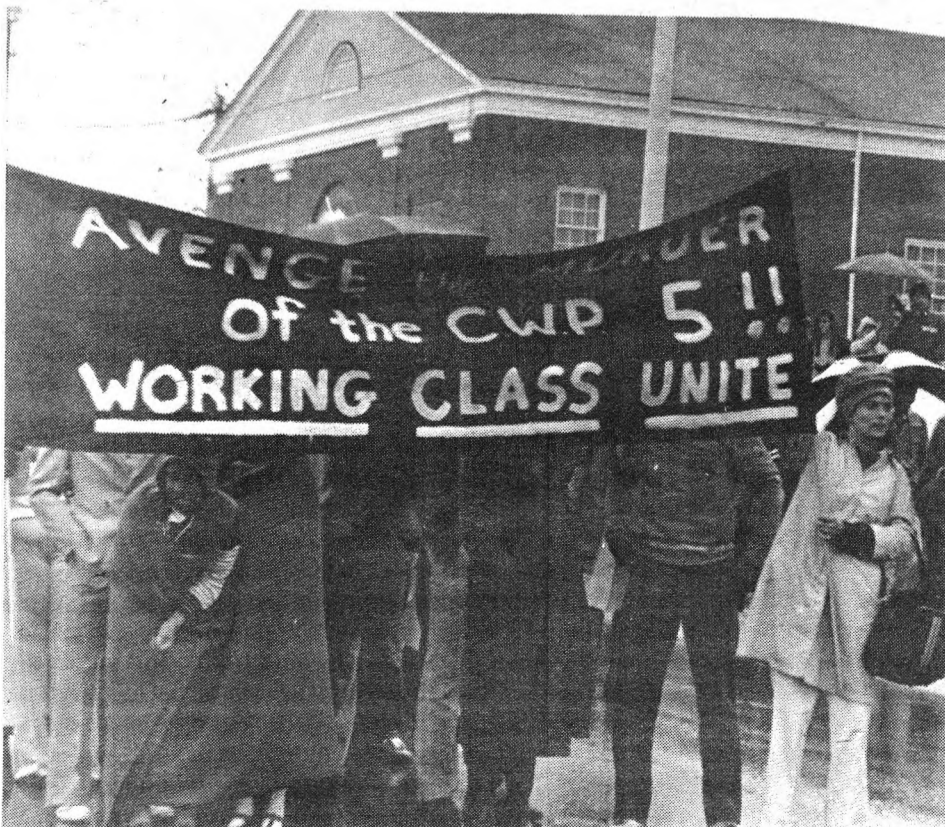
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# Dare To Struggle, Dare To Win!

The day before the march, the Mayor declared a state of emergency, setting up roadblocks around the city and the starting point of the march, searching cars and people coming to attend the burial of the CWP 5. State troopers stopped buses and car caravans coming to the march. They searched for weapons, trying to bust the march before it started. But they were no match for the ingenuity and determination of the masses to make the armed burial of the CWP 5 a success. Twenty-six comrades were arrested just hours before the march. The pigs were so uptight that they made the comrades stand with their hands on their heads while the pigs searched the cars *twice*. All the while other cops stood guard with shotguns pointed nervously at the comrades, and police helicopters hovered overhead. The pigs shook when the comrades began singing revolutionary songs and really freaked out when the comrades chanted, "Long Live the Communist Workers Party!"

On the day of the march, the state pulled out all the stops. They ringed the procession with three layers of troops. The first layer, closest to the marchers, was the local police. National Guardsmen backed up with armored personnel carriers equipped with flame throwers, made up the second layer. On the outside of the Guardsmen were state and federal security agents who shadowed the procession all the way. Overhead two National Guard helicopters circled, and on the rooftops and overpasses flocks of police and FBI sharpshooters perched like vultures. The government was so scared of the masses uniting with the march that they even cut down the bushes along the march route so they could get a clear view of any supporters trying to get into the procession.

## Party Determined to Hold Armed Burial March—At Any Cost

The Party and the masses weren't intimidated one bit by this massive show of government force. We were determined to bury the five comrades at any cost, determined to defend our right of armed self-defense—at any cost. Despite the roadblocks, searches, and the arrests just hours before the procession, the march was armed to the teeth. The government knew it, and there wasn't a damn thing they could do about it. They didn't dare to search any of the marchers, fearful of the situation exploding. They knew that if they dared to attack us again like they did in the Saturday massacre, it would only tighten the noose around their own necks. They knew that a second attack would only expose the fascist heart of bourgeois democracy and drive their criminal capitalist system to the brink of no return.

The bourgeoisie is scared stiff of the Party. They know that we will avenge our five comrades a thousand times over. They know that we march under the banner of Marxism-Leninism, and especially Mao Tsetung Thought—that when we are attacked, we will counter-attack a thousand times harder, charging wave upon wave. That's the invincible spirit of the Party exemplified by the CWP 5 and seen by millions on TV as the comrades charged automatic rifle fire with their bare fists and sticks. And the bourgeoisie *knows* that this spirit will grow a million-fold.

## State Loses Nerve—Punks Out

With all the forces of intimidation and repression at their disposal, the state punked out. They lost their nerve and had to back down, letting the armed procession go on.

Charging forward politically and prepared militarily is what enabled a thousand marchers to take on 1,000 pigs and National Guardsmen and *win the battle of nerves*.

Heads held high, faces full of class hatred and disdain, glaring at the lines of cops and National Guardsmen, their armored vehicles and helicopters, the march was on. Five abreast, rank after rank followed the armed honor guard, led by the widows, and the red-draped coffins of the murdered comrades. At the head of the march, two people carried a 7-foot high picture of comrade Jim Waller, Central Committee member of the Communist Workers Party, National Chairman of the Trade Union Educational League, local President of Local 1113T, ACTWU, and a communist folk hero among North Carolina workers. The two carried the picture, mounted on heavy two-by-fours, the entire length of the march—to the cemetery and back—and refused to let anyone relieve them. The whole procession was ablaze with pictures of all five making sure that the spirit of the five will burn deep in the hearts of the masses and haunt the bourgeoisie a thousand-fold.

## Masses Salute Communist Workers Party Like a Liberation Army

As the procession passed through the community, just before reaching the cemetery, the streets were lined with people who greeted the march as if it were an army of liberation. Under the pouring rain, the masses came out of their houses to salute and chant, stood on rooftops to raise clenched fists of solidarity. One elderly woman sat on her front porch, sweaterless on that cold, rainy day, and watched without

saying a word. But she didn't have to, because the marchers knew where her heart was. They knew that sitting out front was her way of showing her hatred of capitalist oppression and defying the bourgeoisie. It was her way of showing her solidarity with the Communist Workers Party fighters who had given their lives fighting the Klan and Nazis.

And for everyone who came out to salute the procession, thousands more were blocked from getting there by the bourgeoisie. While they were forced to stay home or sit around in corner grocery stores talking about it, they were watching, in spirit with the funeral march all the way—their respect for the Party and its work deepening by the minute. And all of them, both those who were there in body and spirit and those who could only be there in spirit, are part of the new wave of fighters that are stepping forward to embrace the cause of the CWP 5.

At the cemetery, with the procession still in battle formation, comrade Phil Thompson (Communist Workers Party Central Committee member) gave the Party's eulogy of comrades Jim, Cesar, Mike, Bill and Sandy. He spoke of the threefold significance of the assassinations.

## Single Greatest Assassination of Communists in U.S.

He said, "This is the single largest assassination of communists in this

country's history. The CWP 5 were not only fighting against the Klan and Nazis, they were fighting to destroy the entire capitalist system which is the root source of racism and national oppression and daily and constantly breeds Klan and Nazis." The fact that the bourgeoisie and their state apparatus chose to attack the Communist Workers Party shows how much they fear the Party as the staunchest fighters for the masses' interests. "A glance at the history of our 5 Party martyrs is like a glance through the encyclopedia of the struggle of the U.S. workers and Afro-American masses," comrade Phil went on. For example, comrade Jim Waller was elected president of an Amalgamated Clothing and Textile Workers Union local after he led a bitter strike at Cone Granite mill, a strike which strengthened the local tremendously and swelled its ranks from 15 to 200. Vanzetti and the Rosenbergs. It makes the cause of communism concrete to the U.S. people at a time when they really need it," comrade Phil continued. "The U.S. workers as a whole are shaking out of the dormant state caused by the lack of a vanguard Party and temporary stabilization of capitalism for close to 30 years."

The masses can no longer live in the old way and more and more are willing to die for a change in the system. At the same time, the bourgeoisie is hopelessly trapped and entangled among themselves domestically.
