



UPPORT GROUPS NOW SEEN AS PLAYING VITAL ROLE IN INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES.

DLIDA

During the 1984-85 Miners strike a major and new initiative took place when rank and file support groups were formed across the country. The role of the groups was invaluable in spreading support for the dispute, adding a physical presence on the picket line and gaining much needed finance.

When the print dispute at Wapping began in January 1986, many of these groups reformed and they once again, were at the forefront in providing solidarity to the strike. At the demise of the dispute several of the groups together with strikers from the Silentnight bedding dispute decided that the groups should link together on a more permanent Wasis to link together on a more permanent form a rank and file Network.

A series of planning meetings took place which eventually led to a conference being held in Leeds in November 1987. This meeting agreed that the Solidarity Network should be formed officially. The basic aims of the Network was to give solidarity and support to working class disputes and campaigns.

As word has spread about the Network it has drawn in more rank and file support. This is illustrated by the fifteen person steering committee which was elected at the 1988 conference. This contains supporters from Yorkshire, Somerset, the Midlands, Cumbria, Oxford, Kent and London. This spread of supporters across the country has enabled strikers, such as those at P+O at Bover, to be invited into areas and the support to be spread. Many of these groups contain ex strikers and strike activists and their experience is invaluable.

The Network has worked with the Chesterfield Conference Organisation in developing their Trade Union work and have successfully developed several joint initiatives. The Network remains autonomous from the Chesterfield group. Much of the success of the Network has been based on its non sectarianism and the fact that it gives practical solidarity from a rank and file base.

Network i local disputes campaigns the Network is currently involved in preparing assistance for the possible forthcoming docks strike. was the rehearsal or 'dummy run'. They would follow exactly the same routine on the day with a real car bomb. The purpose being to identify and eliminate any possible hitches in advance, but there was another reason. The IRA unit would want to find out if indeed they were under surveilance or if they had attracted suspicion before committing themselves, as so far their only crime was to be in the pocession of false passports. At 15.25pm they returned to the Assembley area paying great attention to the white Renault. All three were highly trained operatives, skilled in the art of counter-surveilance. There actions were designed to invite suspicion, attract attention and so assess the overall security, but most of all they would have been alert to any moves that might indicate that they were being watched. The hunted had become the hunters.

At 15.30pm they left heading northwards towards the border. The Soldier C told the inquest that from then on all three "were very surveilance conscious". Mairead Farrell in particular kept looking over her shoulder, "they were moving fast and frequently checking behind themselves". An MI: man known as 'M' disclosed, "I formed the opinion that they were attempting counter-surveilance". 'H' another from MI5 acknowledged that he followed Savage as he went in and out of the town backstreets, "he deployed very subtle anti-surveilance technique". At one stage Savage had walked behind McCann and Farrell, "I recognised this as countersurveilance to bee if anyone was following his colleagues. I judged them to be highly professional".

ddenly Savage, in spliting off from the other two, turn Suddenly Savage, in spliting off from the other two, turned so quickly he actually bumped into two of the SAS men who were following. Another plain clothes police officer, 'p' stated that he had recognised McCann because he had actually made 'eye contact' with him. Far from 'unsuspecting IRA terrorists', walking into a trap, it is clear that they knew they were under observation, indeed given the circumstances and their actions, it is inconceivable that they did not. The real significance was however that the 'watchers' knew they knew. This triggered the sequence of events that would result in their death.

THE ASSASSINATION.

They were now less than a thousand yards from the Spanish border and relative safety. Suddenly a siren in a police car sounded. The car pulled out of a line of traffic behind the trio, drove pass them and swung around the roundabout at speed. A SAS man known as 'M' said the siren was turned on as it raced back towards the IRA team; "Almost immediately they, Farrell and McCann, stopped. They appeared to turn, a second later the two soldiers went into rigid positions and started firing". Why did they turn? If not to face the people that were following them. This was supported by soldier 'A', the first to fire, who described the moment before the shooting, "Me, McCann had a smile on his face and he Looked straight at me. We had what I call eye to eye contact. We looked directly at eachother". According to civilian witnesses they surendered by putting their hands in the air, and were shot repeatedly in the back and head from less than three feet. 'M' told the inquiry that Savage spun round on hearing the SAS firing at McCann, and Farrell, "I recall quite clearly the expression of amazement on his face". He was probably amazed because it was broad daylight, he knew neither was armed and would have done nothing to provoke such action.

THE CHALLENGE.

THE CHALLENGE.

The evidence of a challenge or verbal warning can be dismissed. In fact due to the unshakeable evidence that there were no warnings, by the time of the inquest the state had changed its story, "I went to shout stop but I actually don't know if it came out, claimed soldier 'A'. The SAS man known as 'C' confessed in relation to the shooting of Sean Savage that the shout of stop, "blended with the firing." Clearly there was no warning.

"THE FATAL MOVES."

McCann had only been dressed in a T-shirt and trousers so where was the gun and detonater concealed ? In the waist-band of his trousers or his pocket. Soldier 'A' said, "The smile went off McCann's face then all of a sudden the right elbow moving, what I would call agrressively, across the front of his body". Soldier 'B' on Farrell said, "Farrell made a sharp move to her right. She made all the actions to carry out the detonation of the radio controlled bomb." According to Soldier 'C' Savage too went for the right side of his jacket. None of the Soldiers. A Book found According to Soldier 'C' Savage too went for the right side of his jacket. None of the Soldiers, A,B or C could explain why they thought Farrell, McCann or Savage made such moves when they had neither guns nor detonators.

The real question is did the SAS <u>belfeve</u> there was a bomb that could be detonated by remote control etc.. Soldier 'C', "I was sure he had gone to initiate the device, my main concern because of the amount of people around. Had I given him time to initiate the device it would have been catastrophic." Soldier "A' said, "The whole worry was the bomb in the bussing area. I thought McCann was definitly going for a button." At the inquest they were to admit that they never searched the bodies for the alleged detonators after claiming that they had killed them because they were convinced they had them.

An electronics expert, Michael Scott, told the inquest that, "The rather grotty car area was the wrong length to recieve a signal and that a radio signal could not have detonated the bomb in any case because it would have had to pass through a block of flats, forty foot thick city walls, a Moorish Castle, part of the edge of the Rock of Gibraltar, a gatehouse and then houses all the way." Further—more he pointed out that by simply unscrewing the car aeriel the SAS would have made the bomb a aeriel the SAS would have made the bomb absolutely useless Apart from these examples of incredulus incompetience, Why did the police not evacuate the area until two hours after the shooting. As Mr C. Columbo, Police Commissioner, revealed, "there was NO RISK. We were not certain there

was a bomb." If the police did not bother to evacuate the area they knew there was no bomb. If the police knew then the SAS knew.

THE MOTIVE.

If there was no threat to civilians why were the three shot repeatedly (Sawage being shot fifteen times) and not arrested. The reason as the Sunday Times Insight Team unwitt ringly revealed on March 13th, a week after the killings, "While there was no definite proof that the car contained a bomb it was essential to stop the trio reaching the border rif the car turned out to be empty, although the evidence might have been sufficient for a conspiracy charge, extradit rion from Spain would be tricky." Unless "Stop" means "Kill" it does no explain why they were not arrested in Gibraltar

THE VERDICT.

The reason was that once Thatcher sent in the SAS Death Squad to Gibraltar it was her intention that the IRA unit would be wiped out. The mistake that exposed the conspiracy was, that due to incompetent surveilance they were forced to kill McCann, Farrell and Savage on the Sunday, before they had planted the bomb rather than after they had planted it on the Monday when the unit would have exchanged the empty Renault with the Red Fiesta containing the bomb. Could they not have arrested them in Gibraltar ? Easily... but all they could have been charged with was pocession of false passports, maximum sentence two years.

That was the real reason for the panic, the real reason for the messy murder in front of dozens of witnesses, in broad daylight, on a sunny Sunday afternoon. The unarmed IRA unit was cutdown on was descibed as a "frenzied attack", less than a thousand yards from the border. Extradition from Spain would be tricky, they now knew there would be no car bomb on Monday to 'justify' the murders because due to the bungled surveilance the IRA unit would not be coming back. The IRA unit was not shot to save lives, they were not shot to protect civilians, they were not slerted by the siren because they were aware of the surveilance, they were given no chance to surrender because it was not the intention to arrest them, there was no challenge. McCann and Farrell surrendered because they had expected to be arrested. Savage ran and was shot in the back. None of the witnesses saw them make any 'suspicious moves' for a remote control device that did not in any case exist. Why would they try to detonate a bomb on Sunday when their intended target was not due to arrive until Tuesday. If it had been their intention to kill civilians they would not have had to travel to Gibraltar to do that. The British

In other words the quest by the employing classes for greater profit, is in eternal conflict with the demands of the working class for higher wages, shorter hours etc. It is in the obvious interest of the employer to keep wages down as low as possible while it is equally obvious that this does not serve the interests of the majority. The two systems capitalism and socialism cannot co-exist, as they are in constant struggle pulling in opposite directions, each in pursuit of its own goals. A victory for one is necessarily a defeat for the other. This is the major source of conflict in the world today. Capitalism is a system which is based on the private ownership of the means of production. This means that the factories, workplaces, natural resources etc, on which we all depend to produce the necessities of life are the private property of a few individuals, who use them to produce not what is most socially necessary, but whatever will make them the most profit. When it suits them, they are able to close down those productive resources, even though there may be great social need for what could be produced on them. Regardless of how rich a country may be in natural resources, capitalism can never provide equality of wealth due to its own laherent limitations. It is obviously impossible for everybody to become a capitalist (employer) and so to function, the system demands the creation and maintenance of an employing class and a working class, or if you like an upper class and lower class. Propping up this system, are the forces of social control—army, police force, civil service etc—all controlled by totally unelected and un-accountable representatives of the capitalist class.

SOCIALISM It is impossible for us today to say exactly what a socialist system will be like, as when it happens there will be millions of others involved in shaping it. However there are some features that would have to be present in any society, before we would be willing to consider it as socialist.

PUBLIC OWNERSHIP Only when all of the major productive resources and industry are taken into public ownership, will it be possible for the democratic will of the majority to ensure that they are at all times employed in the most socially useful manner. This will result in a massive increase in production and wealth. CONTROL OF SOCIETY All those who occupy positions of power and authority will be elected by those they represent and subject to recall.

FREEDOM AND EQUALITY All will be expected to contribute to production and all will receive equal reward and have equal rights, irrespective of sex, race or creed. The state will provide adequate facilities to cater for the needs of the elderly, sick, handicapped, aursing mothers etc., who will all receive a full wage. All questions or personal morality will be free from state interference. Abortion and contraception will be legal and provided by the state. There will be freedom or worship for all religion, but no church will be allowed to interfere in state matters.

INTERNATIONALISM The capitalist economic system is linked up internationally, therefore the struggle to overthrow it is a worldwide one. All workers everywhere have the same interests. It is impossible for socialism to exist in isolation in one country, as the power of international capitalism would crush it.

NO PARLIAMENTARY ROAD TO SOCIALISM Socialism cannot be achi through the parliamentary system, because the real power in society lays not with elected MPs but with rich industrialists and the leaders of the armed forces, police judiciary etc. The present structures cannot be reformed they must be overthrown. The Labour Party does not try to end capitalism, but merely give the workers a better deal within it.

UNION STRENGTH. WE SUPPORT ANY PICKET LINE IN DEFENCE OF WORKERS LIVING STANDARDS. We support a strong organised rank and file movement within the unions. Union officials should be supported as long as they represent their members correctly. But rank and file unionists must reserve the right to take action independent of the officials when necessary.

TOTAL OPPOSITION TO RACISM AND FASCISM We opposed any movement or ideology which attempts to divide the working class on grounds of race, sex, or creed. We recognise the need to oppose fascist organisations, both ideologically and physically on the streets.

THE IRISH NATIONAL LIBERATION STRUGGLE AGAINST OUR OWN THE IRISH NATIONAL LIBERATION STRUGGLE AGAINST OUR OWN RULING CLASS We support the right of oppersed people the world over to fight back. We unconditionally support the right of the revolutionary armies The Irish Republican Army, and the Irish National Liberation Army, to engage in armed struggle to free their country from British rule. We draw great inspiration from the principled and courageous manner in which they conduct their struggle, and from the way in which they have integrated cultural and class expression into their political movement.

THE "COMMUNIST" STATES The regimes in countries such as Russia, China Caba etc, are used as examples to try and prove socialism undesirable. In our view, aithough these countries have planned economies, they cannot be described as socialist. We contend that socialism cannot be implemented from above by an unaccountable ruling elite. Public ownership, freedom and democracy are all essential features of socialism and in their absence it cannot exist. We support the right of the people in these states to overthrow the leadership and implement socialist policies. At the same time however, we recognise the difficulties that states such as Nicaragua—and others past and present—face, from capitalist backed mercenary armies, military intervention, and economic sabotage, which make immediate transition to a socialist system impossible. While these states remain progressive, we will continue to support them.

THE ORGANISATION Traditionally, the structure of revolutionary socialist groups in this country, has been one where the leadership is made up of a small group of self selected academics and intellectual, who wield absolute authority over the membership. Such a structure fails, firstly because there can be no true democracy in such a set up, and corruption soon sets in, and secondly because those leading the organisation are so far removed from the realities of working class life, it cannot relate properly to that class. A revolutionary socialist organisation must be composed of and led by working class people. It must recognise that no leadership is immune from corruption and be truely democratic in its internal structures. It must be ready to work in a non sectarian manner with other socialist and progressive groups. It must present socialist politics in a manner in which working class people can identify with in their life and their work and their leisure. It must be consistent, principled and above all honest in its politics. Only then will it begin to be able to relate to the working class, most of whom today are cynical if not hostile towards the revolutionary left. We recognise that a revolutionary working class party is necessary if capitalism is to be overthrown. We are not that party, neither are those groups militancy, until such time as enough militants can be brought together to form that party.
