This man was brought to San Antonio from Laredo, Texas on April 28 [1921] and is now confined in the guardhouse at Fort Sam Houston awaiting trial on the charge of desertion. He has given the Military Intelligence a long statement concerning radical activities and persons in Mexico and in fact has betrayed all his former associates in the belief that this will cause lenience on trial. Mrs. Gale is in San Antonio, Texas, and expects to remain here until her husband's case is disposed of.
