Notes:

- 1. The above series is that of "initiation stamps actually sold" according to the constitution of the WPA, each new member of the organization was to pay an initiation fee of \$1, receipted by a special stamp for their membership card, the proceeds of which were to go to support the work of the national office. In practice, however, it seems that the collection of these initiation fees were handled differently by the branches of the various federations. Some federations, such as the Finnish and Italian groups, collected the fee in a more or less regular manner, while others, like the Jewish, German, and Latvian Federations, seem to have pretty clearly avoided the use of the initiation stamps altogether. The totals of initiation stamps sold listed here very definitely represents a substantial undercount of the actual number of new members coming into the party in 1923.
- 2, The tally sheet did not include a column for the "Agricultural District." Presumably, any initiation stamps sold to the Dakotas or Eastern Montana were included in the "Unorganized" count.
- 3, The explosion of initiation stamp sales in the 4th Quarter of 1923 combined with a similar burst in the 1st Quarter of 1924 seems to be related to the launch of the *Daily Worker* in January 1924.
