### EVEN COOLIDGE ADMITS IT NOW

In his speech in Kansas City Armistice Day, President Coolidge admitted what the Socialists have been saying ever since the outbreak of the World War, for which many of. them went to prison-that the World War was a total liability and loss to every nation that west into it.

The president said: "It is often said that we profited from the world war. We did not profit from it, but lost from it in common with all countries engaged in it. Some individuals made gains. but the nation suffered great forces. Merely in the matter of our national debt, it will require heavy sacrifices. extended over a period of about 30

years, to recoup those losses. "The war left us with debts and mortages, without counting our obligations to our veterans, which it will take a generation to discharge. High taxes, insolvent banks, suined industry, distressed agriculture, all followed in its train. While the period of liquidation appears to have been passed, long years of laborious toil on the part of the people will be

necessary to repair our loss." For saying virtually the same things against the war Eugene V. Debs was sentenced to a federal prison for ten years.

# Are We Being Pushed Into War With Mexico?

Once more there is danger that American big business interests will push the United States into war with Mexico. Here are a few of the recent sinister developments pointing in that

There are repeated reports that the Yaqui uprising was promoted

by American pro-interventionist agents. The Yaquis are being armed and supplied with munitions from this side of the border through the range of mountains that project from the Yaqui country into Arizona, according to a considerable number of news-

According to reports by American newspaper correspondents in Mexico white men, undoubtedly Americans, are manning the Yaqui machine guns with deadly effect on the officers and soldiers of the Mexican workers' republic.

Simultaneously with the Yaqui trouble, other uprisings are reported, notably an uprising of the Knights of Columbus of Mexico.

While the Knights of Columbus of Mexico were instigating a revolution the Knights of Columbus of the United States held a conference in behalf of intervention and faunched plans to raise and spend \$1,000,000 for propaganda against the farmer-labor government of Mexico.

The Catholic Church, in the midst of these developments, has issued a manifesto, giving as the basis of its opposition to the present Mexican government, the fact that it is a Socialistic government, condemning the policies of the Mexican Federation of Labor and declaring that there can be no reconciliation, no compromise between Catholicism and Socialism. Just as these developments reach their most critical stage the United States

government hands the Mexican government a note preemptorily demanding that the Mexican government revoke its land and oil law which were passed to save the resources of Mexico for the Mexican people.

The American note maintains that in a former conference under the Obregon regime the representatives of Mexico agreed that the new land and oil laws would not be retroactive.

The American note says the laws are retroactive and, therefore, must be changed. The Mexican government has repeatedly declared that the laws are not intended to be and are not in fact retroactive, and will not be applied retroactively.

Outside of the technical merits of this discussion, a great Socialist principle is involved—the right of the people as a whole of any country to own its own soil and basic resources. The Mexican government is struggling to uphold that fundamental right. The wolves of Wall Street are fighting to make racred and eternal under the protection of America guns any acquisition, seizure or theft of land or natural resources in another

Another mighty issue is involved—the right of the workers who beastitute the majority of every country to rule. Mexico is the only Socialistic republic on the Western continent. The workers of America cannot afford to remain outside of this struggle. They can help by spreading the truth. If they permit the workers of Mexico to be crushed by American capitalism they will forge their own
