German Socialists Rout all Other Parties. Many New Members in Reichstag. Socialists Carry Saxony.

Special to Appeal to Reason. New York, June 19.—It is now known that 57 Socialists were elected last Tuesday and in 122 districts second ballots will have to be taken June 25. It is expected that in at least 40 districts Socialists will then be elected, thus giving us about 100 in all.

The Agrarian party has been wiped out and the Felsinnige Volks Partei of Eugene Richter will almost be wiped out, if at the second ballot the national liberals and clericals fail to vote for Richter's men, which is more than likely.
