The great railroad system and many of the greatest industries in this nation have been sold to foreigners who are levying their withering taxes on us just as it is done in India.

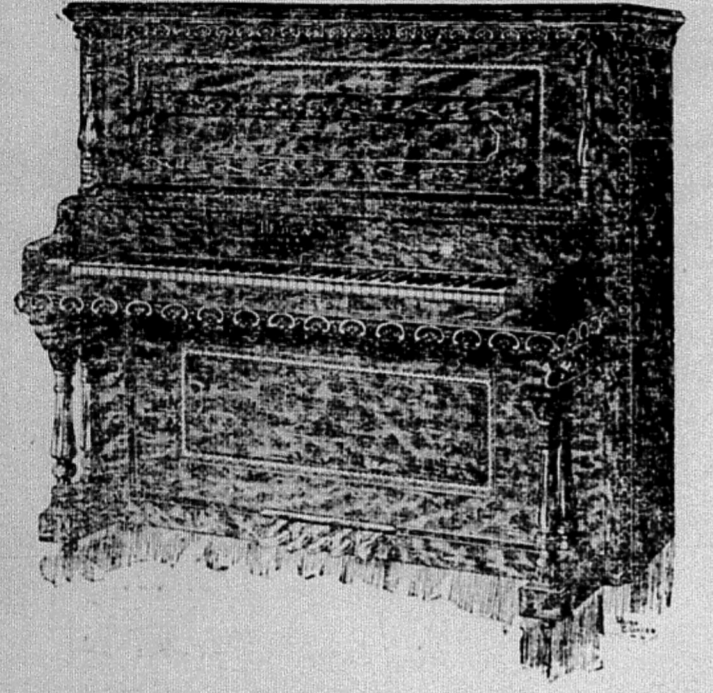
FUTURE BELONGS TO SOCIALISTS.
