WOMEN'S WORK AND PROGRESS

Miss Agnes Wakefield, Boston, Mass. As the Socialist women of Hamburg are allowed by law to be members of political organizations, their activity is of special interest and importance. Comrade Louise Zietz, in her annual report as organizer, says there are now 1700 women members of Socialist clubs in Hamburg.

In the past year the Socialist women of Hamburg have worked with the party and the trades unions for the miners' great strike, the Russian revolution, and the struggle of the Hamburg workers against the attack on suffrage. The women were specially active in collecting money for the striking miners and the Russian revolutionists.

The executive committee of the Socialist party of Italy has laid before the Socialist members of parliament a motion to this effect: "The executive committee, in accordance with the principles of the class struggle, has resolved to energetically conduct agitation to obtain suffrage for all citizens, regardless of sex, and requests the party sections, in co-operation with the trade unions, to persevere in this movement until full suffrage is won."

IN THE WORLD OF LABOR.

We note in our Australian exchanges that the six-hour day is no longer a dream. Some of the miners in New South Wales have gone on strike to enforce a work day not to exceed six hours, and the unions of Melbourne have declared by resolution that they will support the movement.

The Methodist Ministerial Association of Indianapolis proposed sending a fraternal delegate to the central labor body of that city. D. M. Parr, a prominent churchman of the city, sent a protest to the meeting.

Although the parkers of Chicago only made a beggarly 90 cents per head on cattle handled last year, it would seem that they have millions to spend entertaining royalty across the pond, outdoing the king of England himself in lavish expenditure.

Miss Sanger, the secretary of the British association for labor legislation, says that their first annual meeting will be held in the spring. A section is now in formation in the United States; when it is organized, it is expected that the international labor office can afford to publish the Monthly Bulletin in English, as well as in French and German.

Miss Otilie Bander, of Berlin, the central organizer for the Socialist women of Germany, has been speaking on child labor and urging mothers to help enforce the law for the protection of children, which went into effect on January 1, 1906.
