Socialism is committed to franchise, for all men and women, if Socialism is in operation there would be no question of the negro being given the ballot wherever it prevailed. It must be understood, however, that the negro is a menace to the white now chiefly because of exploitation of the negro and the consequent threat upon white labor. Race problems will very largely disappear of themselves as soon as economic justice is done.

If the United States were governed under socialistic principles would the American flag be discarded? There is no reason why it should be. The American flag is symbolical of this patriotic country, while the red flag is symbolical of solidarity of the workers or of universal brotherhood.
