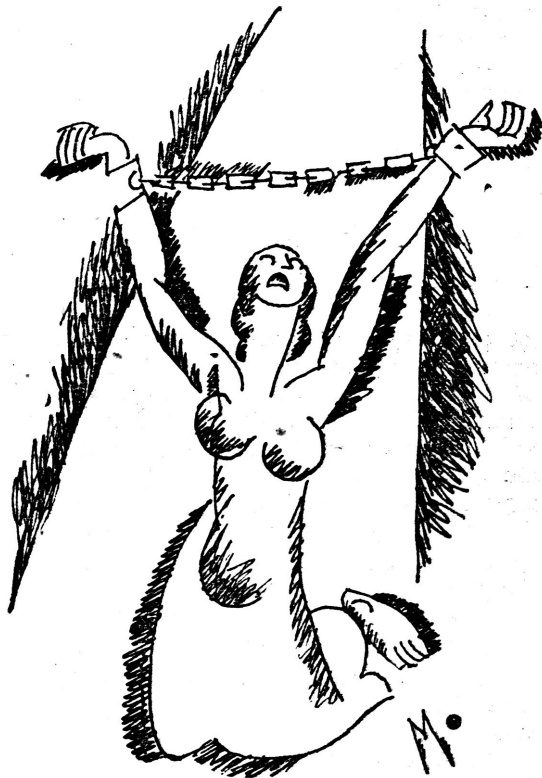


Woman's Day
