

FOR INDUSTRIAL ORGANIZATION.

Manifesto Issued by Conference of A. L. U. Men and Others in Chicago, with Call for Convention in June.

At the beginning of this month a conference was held in Chicago by a number of more or less prominent trade unionists (mostly of the American Labor Union) and others interested in the labor movement.

Local, national and general administration, including union labels, buttons, badges, transfer cards, initiation fees and per capita tax should be uniform throughout.

Workmen bringing union cards from foreign countries should be freely admitted into the organization.

All members should hold membership in the local, national or international union covering the industry in which they are employed.

The general administration should issue a publication, representing the entire organization and its principles, which should reach all workers in every industry, at regular intervals.

A central defense fund, to which all members contribute equally should be established and maintained.

CALL FOR CONVENTION. All workers therefore who wish to meet in convention at Chicago the twenty-seventh day of June, 1905, for the purpose of forming an economic organization of the working class along the lines marked out in this manifesto...
