"I Will Continue to Fight on Lines I Have Chosen," Says Delegate of Montana Workers, Expelled from A. F. of L. Convention

## William Green, of Miners' Union, Appears in Role of Prosecutor, Gompers Judge

(Special to "The Worker.")  
PORTLAND, OREGON.—William F. Dunne, delegate of the Silver Bow (Butte, Mont.) Central Labor Council, has been expelled from the convention of the American Federation of Labor. The charges is that Dunne is a Communist. This is the climax of the red baiting that has been developing hysterically here for the past week. The vote was 7,288 to 130. Leaving the convention hall after the vote had been taken, Dunne declared:

"It will not strengthen the trade union movement to expel me, for I have no doubt the Michigan prosecutor would be glad to hear of it. I will continue to fight the battles of labor on lines I have chosen."

William Green, Secretary-Treasurer of the United Mine Workers' Union, appeared as the chief prosecutor, with President Samuel Gompers as the judge. The real jury, the broad masses of the American workers, was not present. The fake verdict was turned in by grand dukes of the Gompers' reactionary bureaucracy.

Green's attack against Dunne was but a cheap rehearsal of the so-called "red activities." This expose has been exploited by the members of his own union, chiefly by Executive Francis Farrington, of the Illinois Mine Workers.

Those voting against the expulsion of Dunne were the A. F. of L. members of the Pulp, Sulphite and Paper Mill workers, M. J. Sillitney and Gus Soderberg of the Tailors' union; Dunne, representing the Silver Bow Central Council; D. W. Stevens of the Minneapolis Trades and Labor assembly; James A.
