Vote Down Ryan's Settlement Plan Don't Return Until Seamen Settle!

(EDITORIAL)

After all locals on the coast declared over and over again, their determination to light to a finish for their own hiring halls. Ryan and the district officials of, the union, have the audaelty to place for a referendum vote among the workers the proposal of the employers for:

Employer-controlled hiring halls. Employers hire whomever they see fit. There is no provision for even preference to union men. But the I. L. A., recognized as the representative of the workers, is permitted to have a man at the hiring hall, supposedly as a check against discrimination.

Ryan declared that "While we did not get the closed shop we did get what amounts to the same thing and we will have an I. L. A man in waterfront hiring halls to prevent discrimination." an I. L. ination' The district officials have thus far been careful not to make any open statements, as they know the sentiment of the

workers, and wish to keep some influence over the membership, but they are having Ryan take a lead in putting over the plan. The negotiations had hardly ended when Ryan and the district officials rushed to northwest ports, in an effort to put it over there, where they hope the solid front of the workers would crack.

WORKERS AWARE OF TRICKS

But the officials fail to take into account the fact that the workers in the course of the strike have had a fine education on the tricks being used to break their ranks. The workers in San Francisco proved this by the manner in which they at last Saturday's special meeting stalled the plan of the officials to break with the seamen, and take full power for themselves to settle. The workers will not approve this new form of a Fink Hall? A longshoreman will not decide to lay himself at the mercy of

the employers every morning he appears to hire out!

This is precisely what the plan provious. It does not even concede as much as the widely advertised government plan for concede as much as the whely advertised government plan for joint hiring halls. The employers will continue to hire their favorites. The majority of the workers on the front will continue appearing at 6:30 every morning, only to waste their time, or at best get a few hours a week.

The placing of an ILA man in the hiring halls is a huge joke, AS THE POWER LIES IN THE HANDS OF THE SHIPOWNERS, AND HE WILL ONLY BE A DECORATION IN THE

OFFICE. The best he could do is place on record protests against discrimination, and every longshoreman knows that mere pro-

BOSS OFFENSIVE ON TWO FRONTS The fact is, that the employers have launched an offensive

against the workers on two fronts. In the first place it is utilizing Ryan and the union offficials for putting through this outrageous proposal, expecting that it may break the front somewhere. On the other hand through concentrating the police for an attack against the picket lines and arresting the most militant leaders. It is therefore no accident that the negotiations ended on the same day that the San Francisco police ithout the slightest provocation shot into a mass of strikers, and arrested Schoemaker, one of the strike leaders. This was immediately followed by the banning of picketing on the waterfront side of the Embarcadero. The shipowners know that the only obstacle Ryan and the officials have to convincing the workers to accept their proposal is the determination of the workers and the militant leaders. They therefore help them in the effort to break the determination—to arrest the actual strike leaders.



Merriam in Rolph's Boots

Among the first acts of the new governor of California, is to take leadership in the present red baiting campaign. And he does it with a viciousness that surpasses even that which was displayed

by his predecessor. In one way the governor's brazen showing of his hand is welcome, as it gives a clear demonstration to everyone that Rolph's death did not cause the slightest change. Meriiam is only another part of the same reactionary state machine which is geared to oppress the workers and small farmers. There are many people who believe that Rolph alone in the state government, was responsible for the reactionary policy, and hoped that Merriam will mean a change. But such people believe in the "Good Man" theory-fail to see the parties of the bosses-which these people represent.

Governor Merriam says:

These public enemies deliberately provoke demonstrations and incite alarms and time when peace and civil tranquillity are the supreme requisites in our battle for national recovery. Their allen creed of violence and sabolinge strikes venomously at the heart of constitutional democracy.

"Among us, a borde of irresponsible professional agitators, mostly aliens, are trafficking shamelessly in the agonies of these stressful times. They are seeking revolution, not reform; to make conditions worse, not better.

"Against such vicious attacks, in whatever field, your State Government must and will offer uncompromising resistance. "We have adequate laws on the statute books to deal effect-

ively with both violence and incitement. They will be enforced. Roving bands of foreign agitators shall not be permitted to undermine the American ideal of human liberty and ordered freedom under law. Order and constitutional government will be

"On citizens of California there rests a patriotic obligation to resist the destructive machinations of organized Communism; to make known, in every relationship of their daily lives, that they will not countenance violence and sabotage.

The misleaders of the AF of L have nothing on Nathan when it comes to "angling." This last winter he played politics in the Central Labor Council of Oakland and got himself a gravy CWA job, as an educational director. There, in order to build himself a political machine he hired influential AF of L leaders with CWA funds. And although they were incompetent to teach they continued to draw their \$17.20 a week.

About this time the federal government was looking around for a man they could trust as "labor" advisor in the Salmon Code Hearings. You guessed it, Nathan got the job. He was recommended by President Green of the AF of L, always on the lookout for a man with his own; Strengthened by his AF of Lindens.

Looking lout for himself Nathan used his official position as labor advisor to get the workers affected by this Code to join his

By this method he succeeded in signing up about a thousand members, charging them five dollars each for the privilege of shipping out to Alaska. When the TUUL passed out leaflets, at one of the union meetings, Nathan and his henchmen took them away from the workers as they entered the hall.
