

"WHY NOT AGAINST COMMUNISM, TOO?"

Under the above title, Chester Rowell writes in his regular column in the San Francisco Chronicle of March' 27th to explain why he refused to accept the invitation of the League Against War and Faseism to join its

He says he would join this movement if it would change its title to "League Against War and Fascism and Communism". Undoubtedly Mr. Rowell thinks he has performed the master stroke in astuteness in making this answer to the League Against War and Fascism. His specious arguments, however, cannot hide the fact that Mr. Rowell, by his refusal, enrolls himself as one more pro-imperialist agitator.

'In Mr. Rowell's own paper of March 26th, only one day before he wrote his editorial, it is announced that Fascist Hitler had offered Sir John Simon of Britain, a pact for a united offensive against the Soviet Union. The relation between war and fascism here is very

To demand that the League Against War and Fascism shall also struggle against Communism because Communists believe in class war is obviously an evasion of the request of the League that Mr. Rowell take his stand with the antiwar elements. Instead, Mr. Rowell has shown himself to be what he is, the unofficial propagandist for American Imperialism in the Pacific.

All honest and clear thinking people who are sincerely opposed to capitalist war and its brother, fascist terror, will answer the call of the League Against War and Fascism and send delegates or personally attend its Western Congress, which, we are informed, will be held in San Francisco on April 28th, at Carpenters Hall, opening the first session at 10:00 a.m.



did not bring in convictions, the California Vigilantes would spread a reign of terror through the state. He asked them to confirm the C. S. Law so that working class organizers could be railroaded to prison through legal channels, thus sparing the vigilantes their intended rampage with torch and gun.

The workers now locked in the County jail are strike leaders and organizers of the unemployed. The railroading machine which convicted eight of California's best working class leaders to long penitentiary terms in Sacramento, was oiled not only by the subsidies of big financial interests but by the tears of the petty-bourgeoisic. After pronouncing one of the most unjust verdicts ever delivered in a court of law, four of the jurors broke down and wept. One in particular sent flowers to the defendants after they

exactly the stupidity that capitalism depends on to accomplish its ends. If Fascism comes in the United States it will be floated in on the sentimental tears of the petty-bourgeoisic. If it is stopped, it will be stopped by the decisive integrity of the working class. One juror, Howard S. McIntyre, has had the strength of char-

acter to issue a signed, notarized affidavit revealing the stupid corruption by which the verdict was reached. He confesses that the verdict does not represent the honest convictions of either himself or several other jurors, but that it was arrived at by a process of

Juror McIntyre closes his statement with: "The deponent alleges that he makes this affidavit of his own free will and on his own initiative, solely for the purpose of preventing a miscarriage of justice, and of righting a wrong for which I feel partly but deeply responsible." Judge Lemmon, when contronted with this affidavit on Thurs-

day morning, and reacting also to the thousands of telegrams that have poured into his office since last Monday's verdict, postponed hearing on the motion for a new trial until next Wednesday, The frame-up machine which has barged ruthlessly forward to the point of obtaining eight convictions, is now staggered by the

weight of its corruption. What juror McIntyre has experienced and reacted to so strongly, is not a "miscarriage of justice" but an inside view of the workings of capitalist justice as a whole. 



"Believe It Or Not" Ripley Is the World's Greatest Liar






SOVIET FARMER SHOWS HIS GAINS. This member of a collective farm is showing how his income has increased. The smaller bag shows how much he received for each working day in 1932, the larger one shows what he got in 1933. The small one is marked 5 kilograms, about 12 pounds, the larger one is marked 8 kilograms, or about 18 pounds. In 1934 his income would be still larger. This is only part of what he gets; he shares in the collective farms' production of potatoes and other vegetables, and of meat and, dairy products. Besides this he gets his share in the cash income of the collective farm from the sale of the farm's products.





Hearst and his henchmen will stop at no lie about the Soviet Union. But these liars can't even be consistent in the lies they tell. Hearst himself uses as his authority a Nazi propagandist named Ammende, who has never been in the Soviet Union. This faker, in an effort to reconcile workers to their hardships under Hitler, made this statement, accepted as Gospel by Hearst: "Last year, it was admitted the grain crop was fair. Even then it is estimated between five and ten million people died of starvation."

The latest liars, Ripley and Emma Goldman, estimate the number at 2,000,000 in 1932, not a year later as Ammende says. Emma. by the way, hasn't been in the Soviet Union since shortly after the Revolution. That may account for her being an expert on the





The history of America has been a history of linservice crusades against corruption, against crime, against graft, against poverty, against war. The achievement of this virtuous bombast is that today America is the foulest sink of corruption in all its history, it is facing the most serious crime wave of all time, it is so ridden with graft that thousands of men and women have adopted the conclusion that graft is "human nature" and one must accept it and make the best of it. Mass poverty in America has reached a scale never before equalled. That this poverty exists in the wealthiest land on earth and is attributed to "over-production" testifies sufficiently to the insanity of its government

THE CLIPPER FLIES TO WAR

The flight of the Clipper plane to Hawaii is America's bid for Imperialist power in the Orient. It is the challenge of American capitalism to Japan and competing European powers. It is a bold announcement that American interests not only refuse to relinquish their exploiting interests in China, but intend to compete in the armed struggle for power which is shaping in the East.

The flight of the Clipper is incidental to the establishment of a trans-Pacific air-line which proposes to begin service sometime this year. The commercial value of this line is so questionable that it will have to be supported by government subsidies. Its value as a war measure is plain.

TO BUILD, AIR BASES IN THE PACIFIC

It brings the Orient closer to the Pacific Coast. It involves the establishment of airbases along the whole route-bases which would be essential in a war. It involves the development and maintenance of high powered transport planes#

The importance of air power in the coming Imperialist struggle in the Orient is evidenced by the fact that Britain is constructing vast airdromes at both Hong Kong and Singapore. France is building another at Hanoi. A million dollar factory is being constructed (under foreign subsidy) at Canton, which will turn out 20 planes per day. Japan has placed huge orders for Zeppelins with Germany, under the guise of establishing a Commercial

The U.S. makes her own bid by establishment of the trans-Pacific line, by increasing her naval air forces on the Pacific Coast by 130 planes, by the largest naval maneuvers in American history to be held during May in which air forces will play a major part.

DRAWING COMMERCIAL LINES INTO WAR SERVICE Bills are now before Congress calling for the induction of all transport pilots into the air reserves and for the establishment of land and sea airforces as separate divisons, operating independ-

ent of other branches. This last is evidence of the growing self-sufficiency of air forces as a war machine.

Germany, it will be remembered, completely re-constructed her military air force under the pretence of "commercial develop-

The trans-Pacific line was projected after a survey made by Senator McAdoo and the Senate has added \$2,000,000 to the \$7,000,000 Post Office appropriation in order to assure its com-

EARTHQUAKES AND ECONOMICS

Two major earthquakes are reported in April. In Formosa the death toll is well over 3000. Homeless refugees number

In Persia 500 are reported killed in a quake.

Earthquakes are not traceable to the economic greed of the ruling class. However, a large proportion of the death, misery and destruction is.

Whenever the violence of nature strikes, it is the poor it hits first and hardest. In the matter of earthquakes, they live crowded in the narrowest quarters and inhabit the cheapest buildings. When fires rage in cities they blaze highest among the wooden tenements of the workers. The wealthy never freeze to death in the streets during Winter.

During the quake that shook Southern California in 1933, the movie actors of Hollywood fled in airplanes. The poor remained to witness an extraordinary sight. Half of Long Beach had collapsed in wreckage. But the fact that these buildings collapsed burrying beneath them the dead bodies of hundreds of workers, was not entirely owing to the quake. Some buildings remained standing intact while the buildings on both sides of them fell in complete wreckage. The men and women who died beneath those timbers were murdered not by "forces of nature" but by the greed and graft that went into the construction of the city.

PERHAPS WORSE DISASTER NEXT YEAR

As a consequence, the dust storms of this year reached the proportions of a major catastrophe. In view of the continued policies of the administration, we may look for still more serious

The capitalist system, in the course of its early development, changed America from a wilderness to fertile farm lands. In its present breakdown, we now see its disintegration from fertility to desert.

Unable to plan, the captalist system is as helpless to cope with the forces of nature as it is with economic problems. Its efforts are not toward facing and solving these problems but toward preserving, at all costs, the system of private ownership and exploitation. Any plan that would meet the problems either of economics or concerning the preservation and development of resources, would, of necessity, make inroads on the capitalist

THE C. C. C. MAKES KILLERS

The lying government and newspaper propaganda assuring a doubting public that the C. C. C. camps are no more than healthful recreation camps for America's unemployed youth, is very bluntly refuted by the following statement appearing in the April 13th issue of the Army and Navy Journal, published in Washington, D. C.:

"The number of C. C. C. camps is to be increased from 1431 to 2916, with an ultimate strength of 700,000. This will provide excellent opportunities for reserve corps officer training as well as extended management by the Regular Army. It is easy to predict, in the light of experience, that the job will be well done."

We have been asked why the Western Worker does not carry the union label and we feel a note of explanation is due. The Western Worker has always been set up and printed entirely by union men, members of the International Typographical Union.

Prior to the vigilante raids of last summer our work was' done by the Triangle Printing Company who were allowed to put the label on the paper without question. After the wreckage of our offices and the Triangle shop by the vigilantes we were forced to change shops and the new printers made application for the union label. The existing union shops to whom we offered the job frankly admitted that they were intimidated and were afraid to take the work at any price.

The label was refused on the grounds that our four hours of mailing a week is not done by union members. This is an undoubted evasion by the union officials, who had no objection to our using the label before the raids, even though our mailing was done then, as now, by trusted members of the Communist

Because of the dangers involved in letting our mailing lists go into the hands of non-Party people we insist on protecting our readers against the possibility of Industrial Association stool pigeons, by having the entire mailing handled only by trusted Communists who are assigned to it.
