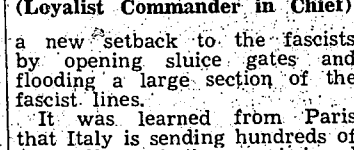

The Need to Unite for a People's Budget

IN THE HALLS of Congress in Washington, a foul plot is under way against the people of this country.

Setting one group of the people off against other groups, the way is being prepared for a reactionary budget, violating every promise made by the administration of sock and reform under the silent approval of the Ad-

administration. It is proposed to slash the budget for farmers' relief; but farmers are being told that if there are bigger cuts in the budget for the unemployed, then perhaps the budget for the farmers may be increased.

At the same time, the unemployed are told that it is the burden of appropriations for the farmers which will make relief cuts necessary.

Through such trickery, a farm appropriation cut of half from the originally proposed \$5,000,000 has been passed.

Programs for housing and for mortgage agencies for the small homeowners are being headed for the scrap heap.

Reactionary Democrats, particularly those of the South, are working closely with the Liberty League-Hearst aggregation in both House and Senate.

Not so long ago Congress and the Administration passed, without any to-do about "economy," the largest naval and army appropriations in the peace-time history of the country. It seems that in the eyes of our lawmakers the slaughter of the American people is of far greater importance than its welfare.

The eyes of the American people have a far different slant on such an all-important question. It remains for the American people to express themselves and to act on the budget trickery.

The American people who defeated the Hearst-Liberty League forces last November now have the task of uniting to defeat the forces of reaction who are having their own way on the budget question.

The trade unions, the Workers Alliance, farm groups, housing and social agencies must not allow any delay in the present of People's Budget which will provide for the needs of the American people, and which would make those who can so well afford it—the rich—pay.

The "Little Wagner" Bill

THE STATE SENATE has voted, 28 to 6, not to bring the Yorty Little Wagner Bill to the floor, which is another way of burying the measure. The "Little Wagner" Bill had been passed in its original form by the Assembly; it has fared badly at the hands of the reactionary upper house.

The Senate labor and capital committee first attempted to emasculate the bill by leaving agricultural workers out of its provisions. Then, at the insistence of open shop lobbyists, sections which might be construed as hampering company unions were neatly sliced off.

Since the passage of an emasculated bill recognizing the right of working men and women to organize, might prove a dangerous precedent to the open shoppers, even the "fixed" bill is being buried.

But what is buried can be exhumed; and what is more, what has been taken out of the Yorty bill can be put back. The passage by the Senate and the enactment into law of the original Yorty bill is of great importance to organized labor if California is to become 100 per cent organized.

Only a few weeks remain of the legislative session. There is still a good chance to force the Senators to bring the original Yorty Bill onto the floor, and to pass it. It demands immediate pressure from organized labor—from unions, from central labor bodies, and from all progressive organizations and individuals, in the shape of demands on the Senate and children to break the historic seaman's strikes. They refused to recognize the officials democratically elected by the membership.

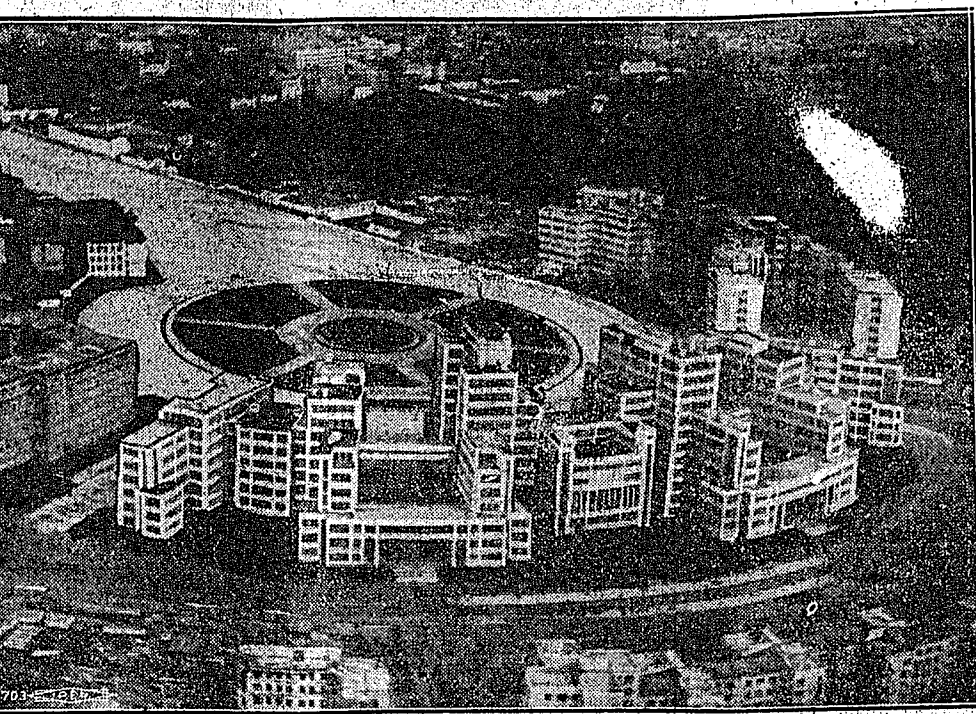

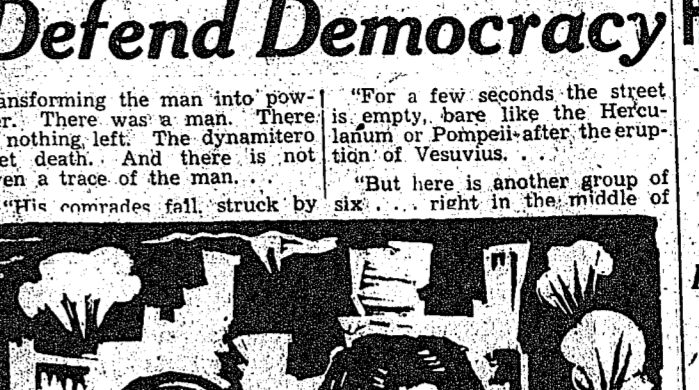
