

L. A. Kress Store Pickets Defy Injunction of Court

STORE LOSING AS CUSTOMERS JOIN BOYCOTT

LOS ANGELES — Defying a temporary order issued by Judge Rubin Schmidt last week, hundreds of Negro and white citizens continued to picket the Kress Store at 4416 S. Central Avenue, denouncing its refusal to hire negro salesgirls.

In the effort to stop the demonstration and the attendant boycott, Pervis Perry, Negro Communist leader of the pickets, was arrested for contempt of court and court attaches were kept busy passing out copies of the temporary injunction which was stepped into line to replace those who had been given the court order.

Hearing on the temporary injunction was set for Wednesday, but the picketers will appear in court to show cause why the injunction should not be made permanent. Loren Miller, Negro attorney, announced he could represent the defendants.

Sympathy Shows
Increasingly sympathetic among residents and small business men toward the picketers became highly apparent as reliable sources reported that Kress' business had suffered a sharp decline since the picket line was started.

Further evidence of the popular response to the picket line came when the Sentinel, a neighborhood newspaper on the South Side, printed a front page editorial in support of the picketers and in denunciation of the Kress policy of discrimination.

Restraint orders may serve a legal purpose but they cannot compel the bestowal of patronage. Kress officials might as well learn that now as later.

More than 100 persons have daily kept the picket line going from 9 a. m. to 12 noon and from 2 to 6 p. m. Pervis Perry, close to 1,000 persons have taken their places in the line since it started last week.

The Kress store picket line was composed of citizens of all racial groups. It was declared the Sentinel, "men and women who are appearing in the line when their sons and daughters seek jobs."

Franco 'Saves Face' In Santander Fall

Fascists Turn to Northern Attacks When Repulsed At Madrid

Spanish fascism and its allies, for the moral effect, require the appearance of "victory" after every major defeat of its main military plans.

Stopped on the entire central front reaching from the French border in Aragon, on around the decisive Madrid sector, down to the south coast of France, devoted his attention to the isolated Loyalist northern territory. Ringed by Italian fascist troops on land and retreat, and supplies cut off by the sea, the Basques and the Asturians have fought an unequal battle against Fascism, made infinitely worse by the initial mistakes and treacheries of the Loyalist forces.

The fall of Santander again emphasizes the sagging of the military plans and the fascist activities in the North of Spain. We do not mean here to belittle or set-aside the loss of Bilbao or of Santander. Every gain by Fascism anywhere in Spain means slaughter of the masses and the prolongation of the war.

The intervention of a big Italian army in Spain brought into play Franco's aims and Mussolini's military prestige. The smashing defeat of the Black-shirted legions in the Guadalupe area made Mussolini scream out for a face-saving expedition. By a combination of Nazi aviation and Italian infantry, interspersed with the prearranged taking of Madrid and Barcelona first.

General Franco then devoted his attention to Madrid again; but the loss of Bilbao had changed the entire military aspect of the struggle.

Under the Negri government the People's Front, with a powerful buttressed People's Army, went on the offensive with the spectacle of Brunete and the balance of a military gain for the Loyalists on Spain's most decisive sector.

Francisco was bogged down and in danger of being mired on the northern advances had to be decided. The People's Army was reforming its lines for a new offensive. It was then Franco concentrated the Italian troops (particularly the Black Army division) who were not being risked on the Madrid front for fear of another Guadalupe, for another face-saving "victory" at the expense of the northern Loyalist strike.

But the factors which led to the People's Front Brunete offensive and the tremendous strengthening of the Aragon Front are at work to hurt even greater forces against Franco on the decisive battlefields of Spain. That Mussolini has little faith in the effectiveness of his "victories" either at Bilbao or at Santander is proved by the fact that the Italian navy has virtually gone into the war against the Spanish government.

REACTIONARY LOSSES OUT IN MEXICO GOVT

Cedillo, Leader of Private Army, Repudiated Over Students' Strike
MEXICO CITY — Gen. Saturnino Cedillo, secretary of agriculture, has resigned from the Mexican cabinet and, much to the surprise, his resignation has been accepted by President Cardenas.

The fall of Cedillo was greeted jubilantly by all groups of left and reactionary workers for the general had earned the hate of labor as the most fascist and reactionary minister in Cardenas' progressive administration. Even while a member of the cabinet, he was known to be a supporter of Calles, the strong man of Mexico, now in exile in the U. S.

Trade unions and political labor groups have long been bitter enemies of Cedillo. He is one of the main backers of fascist organizations here. He has been many a strike, especially in his home state of San Luis Potosi, and in other parts of Mexico.

The labor organizations of this state united and issued posters and leaflets in which they attacked the dissolution of his private army and his resignation.

Started July 19, the strike of the cultural college started on July 19 and lasted for several weeks. Teachers as well as students, who were ignored by the ministry and were still ignored by Cedillo, the president himself, declared that if Cardenas supported this strike, he would resign from the cabinet.

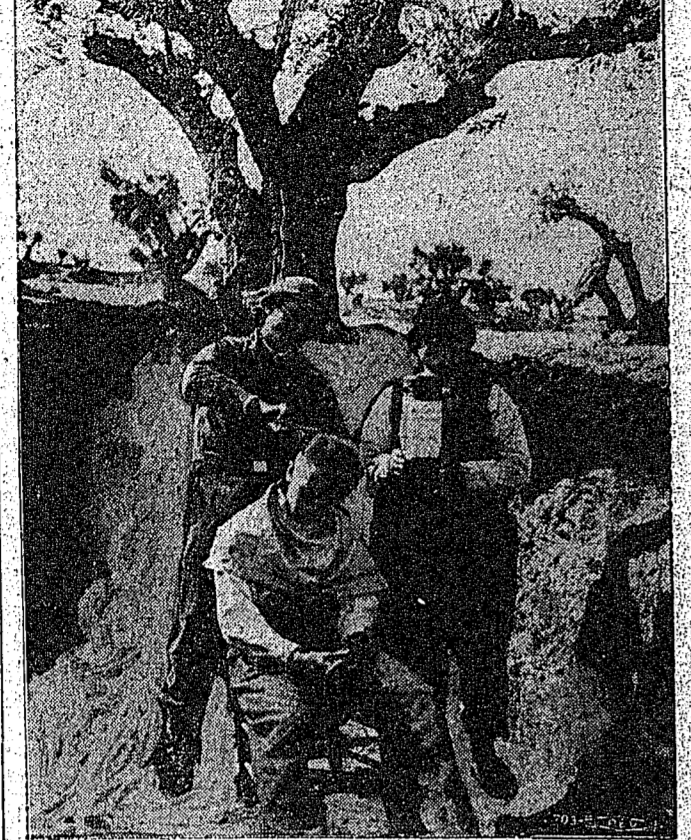

Pedro Caucus to Consider Resolutions Combating State Federation's Dual-Company Union Policy

LONG BEACH—With the issue of labor-splitting and strike-breaking activities by its officials sharply before State Federation of Labor convention, 800 delegates will convene here Monday morning, their ranks considerably depleted by arbitrary expulsions by Secretary Vandeleur.

Progressive delegates are meeting Sunday, September 15, in the Carpenters Hall in San Pedro, to consider a progressive program drawn up by the California Conference of Central Labor Councils, which was formed last spring to combat Vandeleur's splitting moves.

Denounce Vandeleur—The resolution denouncing dual and company unions, as introduced by Vandeleur, and denouncing collaboration with employers to set up unions contrary to the wishes of the workers, and to displace unions already in the field.

Another resolution, for no raising of jurisdictional disputes during a strike, for all such disputes to be settled by the arbitration of the workers involved, and for all picket lines against employers to be maintained regardless of the unions involved.

For Democratic Elections—The caucus will also consider a resolution calling for democratic election by the membership of the State Federation of Labor, a resolution calling for a program of employment to be set up in agricultural counties with labor represented in its activities, and for the election of state delegates of any union or central body at the convention, if these organizations have not been affiliated to the Federation for the time specified in the resolution.

Without waiting for the convention to assemble, Vandeleur announced recently in the San Francisco Central, L. A. members might just as well stay at home, for they are not going to be heard at the convention.

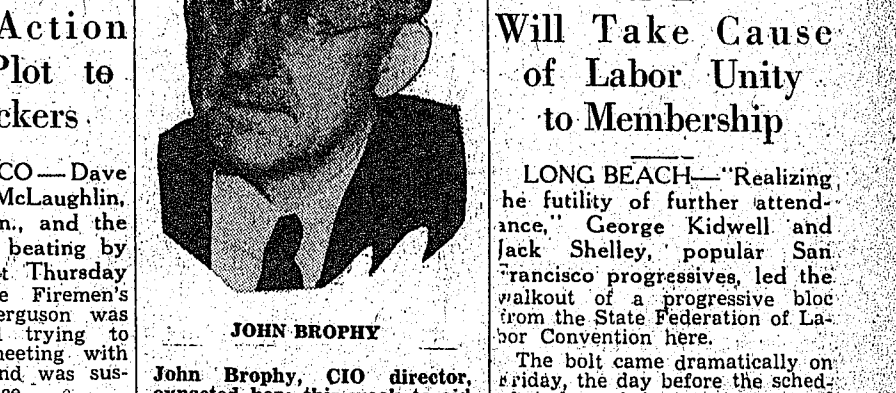

Issue Bulletin Calling for Action Against Beck And Real

OAKLAND—"We members of the union are the only ones who should make decisions that affect the entire membership. We demand that a referendum vote be taken on all important questions, and that all decisions of the executive board be subject to the approval of the membership in regular meetings."

With these words a rank-and-file group of teamsters here last week threw down the gauntlet to Charlie Real, East Bay Teamster, Union Czar. The quotation is taken from a Teamster Bulletin issued in the name of the Rank-and-File Committee.

Getting Wise to Real
The union has not met for the past five months. Real is attempting to enforce the blockade against the stevedores and warehousemen, and the membership of his union is getting wise to him.

Regarding the waterfront situation the Bulletin says:
"Brother Teamsters let us take a candid camera shot of the struggle and a strike confronting the waterfront. As we all know, the struggle has thrown hundreds of teamsters out of work in the Bay Area. You may be working steady today, but will you be working tomorrow?"

"The NLRB has passed a ruling that the ILWU has complete jurisdiction over the warehousemen. Who in hell is the 'Czar' to defy the U. S. Government? Any time the big shots think the rank and file teamsters are going to fight the rank and file of the ILWU they are sadly mistaken. We have been and always will be on the friendly terms."

"How long are we going to sit back and let the big shots take us out of our jobs? Did we vote 'Yes' on this lockout?"
Flay Dave Beck
The rank and file teamsters demand democracy in their union. They demand a plug board system of hiring similar to that used at the waterfront, and they demand that the draymen be forced to hire through the union hall and not off the street as is the practice now.
